

## Have a Green Christmas.

Everyone loves the peace and joy of the Advent season but the Christmas holidays are also a time of year when we create more waste and use more energy than almost any other time. Help reduce waste and save energy this holiday season in the following simple ways:

• Buy a real tree! An artificial Christmas tree must last 20 years to be as sustainable as using a real tree every year. Even better, plant some trees and grow your own future trees.

• Use LED energy efficient lights and a timer – you can cut your electricity bills by 50% or more! Recycle old lights at local electronics recyclers like Green Lights in Blaine.

• Use electronic greeting cards, recycled cards or cards made from recycled content.

• Throw a zero waste Holiday party! Use real plates, silverware, etc. or compostable dinnerware. Compost all scraps and recycle all paper items. Strive for zero garbage.

• Use newspaper or recycled paper for wrapping presents. Look for plastic-free packaging and buy in bulk to avoid unnecessary plastic material.

• Give kids battery-free toys or buy rechargeable batteries and use them. 40% of all batteries are purchased and used around Christmas.

• Give of your time or talent – Give people coupons for your time or for a baked item or craft item that you are known for that you can give them later. The memories you help create will last far longer than any material items you might give. Enjoy the Holidays and keep the joy alive and God's Earth green!






## Keep Christ in Christmas Poster Contest
