

Climate Change Threats to Pregnant Women

As global temperatures and emissions rise so does the impact of climate change on public health.

Globally women are more vulnerable to the effects of climate change than men. They make up a majority of the world's poor and depend the most on natural resources. In the U.S. one group of women particularly at risk are pregnant women.

Climate related complications of air pollution and heat significantly increase the risk to maternal, fetal and infant health. Climate threats only worsen the pre-existing maternal health crisis in the U.S. and yet few people know about the danger,

Pollutants from cars, fossil fuel plants and smoke from wildfires degrade air quality and create more risks for pregnant women and their fetuses such as cardiac and respiratory disease and puts stress on mental health. Microscopic air pollutants can go deep into a mother's lungs that can then cross into the placenta.

Extreme heat can stress the mother and trigger reactions from dizziness to cardiac arrest. There is more public information about protecting pets from extreme heat than there is about protecting pregnant women.


Do you want to share your gifts with others? We have several volunteer opportunities that we would love to fill with our wonderful Parish Family members!

#### Domestic Violence Does Not Take a Holiday

Popular perception has long held that domestic violence increases during the holiday season due to heightened alcohol consumption, stress, tension, anxiety, overwhelming expectations, financial pressures and strained family relationships.

However, the idea that domestic violence increases because of holiday stressors can create misconceptions and perpetuate myths around the root cause of domestic violence.

Although these conditions may make an abusive relationship more complex, impact a survivor's overall safety and elevate their danger level, they are not inherently the root cause of domestic violence. Claiming that these circumstances alone cause domestic violence shifts the blame and responsibility away from the abuser and onto the stress of the holidays, therefore perpetuating the cycle of violence. Abuse lives inside those who believe they have the inherent right to have power and control over others. Abuse does not come and go like the holiday season. It is intentional, coercive and violent. But it does not have to be a holiday tradition. Remember: Anyone can become a victim of domestic abuse or violence. It is not a sign of weakness or stupidity. (YWCA Center for Safety and Empowerment) Our parish's Domestic Violence Awareness and Action group is committed to helping to stop the cycle of abuse through the holidays and at all times.
