
All of us at Mary Our Queen wish you a very Merry Christmas! Please note the following schedule changes over the Christmas Season:

PASTOR'S REPORT



My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

A Blessed Christmas to all of you. I am grateful that you are back here again even though it was literally just yesterday that we celebrated Christmas – the Nativity of the Lord. Today we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. The Gospel reading jumps twelve years of Jesus' life where Mary and Joseph found Jesus missing on their way back

from Jerusalem only to find him in the Temple – the House of His Father.

The gift of the Holy Family is a blessing to all our lives because of the sacrifices that they had to undergo to bring our Savior of the World into our lives. Through the scriptures, we hear the hardships that they had to endure to bring Jesus into the world beginning with His birth in a manger. We later hear how Joseph had to take Mary and Jesus and flee to Egypt to protect Jesus from Herod and this weekend's reading, we hear how Mary and Joseph had to search for Jesus to the point of returning back to Jerusalem and finding him in the Temple.

We are indeed Blessed by the gift of the Holy Family as they serve as an inspiration of unconditional love and sacrifice for families. They trusted in God leading them and invites us too to place our faith in God.

Christmas is a season. We spent the season of Advent preparing our lives to celebrate His birth. Now we are invited to celebrate it. The season of Christmas concludes with the Baptism of the Lord on January 9. We celebrate it by allowing the gift of Christ to dwell in our hearts and lead us each and every day of our lives.

December 17 marked the beginning of the second part of Advent. Our preparation is now centered on the celebration of Christmas. The Gospel readings each day focuses on the infancy narratives drawn from the Gospel of Matthew and Luke. This in turn helps our preparation for Jesus' first coming into our world with his birth in the manger.

On behalf of Fr Mario and myself, we would like to take this opportunity to wish you a Merry Christmas. May the peace and joy that comes from the birth of our Savior multiply throughout your lives.

In our narthex, we have a Memorial Tree to remember our loved ones who have passed. Feel free to put an ornament on the tree in memory of your loved one.

We continue to pray for all those affected by COVID-19. We also continue to do our best to keep everyone safe. While the mask mandate of our city has been lifted, we have made available the left side of our Church for those still wanting to social distance. We continue to request that mask be used when coming forward to receive Communion. Thank you for kindly working with us. We will reevaluate these protocols on a week to week basis. As a reminder, please monitor COVID-19 symptoms. As always, if you or a family member has a fever, chills, body aches, headache, sore throat, cough, and loss of taste and smell, they should stay home from school or church until symptom free.

Today's Host: Deacon David Medeiros

Finding Jesus in the Temple.

After three days they found him...

Allegorically (St Ambrose) the discovery of Jesus in the temple prefigures his Resurrection, when Christ will be three days absent in death, only to be found aagain in the fles. The anxiety following his burial will likewise give way to joy and relief at his rising. Ignatius Catholic Study Bible p. 111.

The Catechism tells us: CCC534 The finding of Jesus in the temple is the only event that breaks the silence of the Gospels about the hidden years of Jesus. Here Jesus lets us catch a glimpse of the mystery of his total consecration to a mission that flows from his divine sonship: "Did you not know that I must be about my Father's work?" Mary and Joseph did not understand these words, but they accepted them in faith. Mary "kept all these things in her heart" during the years Jesus remained hidden in the silence of an ordinary life.

Let us too ask for the grace that Mary and Joseph possessed; to accept the things with faith, that we don't understand. Especially those things that come to us, within our own families.

Praise the Lord!
