ASSOCIATE PASTOR'S REPORT

Life A Precious Gift

ANOINTING

The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because He has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor.

CCC695 Anointing. The symbolism of anointing with oil also signifies the Holy Spirit, to the point of becoming a synonym for the Holy Spirit. In Christian initiation, anointing is the sacramental sign of Confirmation, call "chrismation" in the Churches of the East. Its full force can be grasped only in relation to the primary anointing accomplished by the Holy Spirit, that of Jesus. Christ means the one "anointed" by God's Spirit.

CCC2443 God blesses those who come to the aid of the poor and rebukes those who turn away from them: "Give to him who begs from you, do not refuse him who would borrow from you"; " you received without pay, give without pay." When "the poor have the good news preached to them," it is a sign of Christ's presence.

Before we do our daily tasks, let us cry out to the Lord to anoint us, especially when those tasks involve the poor.


