FROM THE PASTOR:

Thanks to Fr. Solomon Farinto, who generously offered to be present to preside at Masses this weekend, to allow me to be gone for my annual retreat. One of my most treasured scripture quotes, which I know has appeared in this column multiple times, is Psalm 127:1: "Unless the Lord build the house, in vain do we labor." Retreat is the time for us priests to go away from the ministry we undertake to ask the Lord to build in us the spiritual gifts that we need to serve as ministers of Jesus Christ. Each day, I will take ample time for Mass, prayer, and spiritual reading, seeking the gifts of the Holy Spirit that will allow me to be a fruitful, effective pastor. Thank you for your prayers for me—and I will certainly be praying for the entire St. Edward Parish family.

On March 25, the Solemnity of the Annunciation (commemorating the coming of the angel Gabriel to the Blessed Virgin Mary, with the announcement that God desired that she become the Mother of God). Pope Francis, at the behest of the bishops of Ukraine, made an "Act of Consecration of Russia and Ukraine to the Immaculate Heart of Mary." What was the intention of the Holy Father by this action? First, consecration means to "set aside something for holiness," for the work of God. For example, when St. Edward Church was founded 77 years ago, the new church space was "consecrated," that is, set aside for the holy work of our prayer and the life of our parish. When individuals choose to enter a monastery, they are choosing to live a "consecrated" life, that is, a life set aside for the holy work of the prayer and ministry of a particular religious community.

So...what about "setting aside for holiness" two entire countries, Russia and Ukraine? As with a parish or an individual seeking to live "consecrated life" as a religious priest, brother or sister, the consecration of nations begins with an act of dedicating a people for holiness, which will then need to be fulfilled over time, as under the power of the Holy Spirit, persons are transformed more fully into holiness. By his act of consecration of Russia and Ukraine to the Immaculate Heart of Mary, Pope Francis is calling upon the powerful intercession of the Mother of God, asking that her heart be moved to pray for the holiness of the Russian and Ukrainian peoples (leaders, citizens, soldiers, etc.), that they might be converted to the gospel of peace and justice.

Many churches around the world joined in this act of consecration (as we did at St. Edward), pleading to the Mother of God to ask her Son to send the Holy Spirit into the hearts of the peoples of Ukraine and Russia, that the holiness of peace and justice might reign more fully. Through the prayers of the Mother of God, may the allure of violence and warfare flee, one heart at a time, and may those harmed by war's violence be consoled, strengthened and healed by the power of God and the efforts of all people of good will!

Have you registered for the upcoming **Agape Meal**, to be held following the Holy Week 5:30 pm Mass on Wednesday (April 13)? This parish gathering, where we will share a meal after Mass while hearing the encouraging witnesses of members of our St. Edward Parish family, will be a real boost to your Lenten observances. I know it will be a most uplifting experience, as we build towards that most uplifting of all our holy days, Easter Sunday.
