

Palm Sunday — "Fall silent before the cross, our only hope"

As we enter this Holy Week, we prepare to celebrate the Sacred Paschal Triduum—Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter (beginning with the Easter Vigil). During these three holy days, we celebrate the passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus—the Paschal Mystery—which marks the core of our faith. This week we fall silent before the Cross of self-emptying love to comprehend the mystery that brings us new and everlasting life. We fall silent before the Cross, our only hope.

For reflection:

What were the great losses in my life, and how did my faith in the death and resurrection of Jesus help me recover?

What losses do I fear in the future, and how will my faith help me anticipate the new life which follows?

What do I need to do to Fall Silent and open myself to truly experience the love of God through the Paschal Mystery this Holy Week?

FROM THE PASTOR:

With this week, we finish our parish's Lenten "Book Club" of reading Richard Hauser's In His Spirit. If you were not able to complete your reading, why not take on the project during this upcoming Holy Week, to set aside the phone, turn of the TV, and dig into this book. As I mentioned back in the first week of Lent, the reading can be at times challenging, but NOT too challenging. If we are to grow in our faith, we ought to expect nothing less than the dying and rising of Jesus in us—the dying of confusion and ignorance and the rising of clarity and knowledge. I have never found this intellectual process easy! Furthermore, that the subject is the Holy Spirit, the third person of the Holy Trinity, Continued \rightarrow

means that the book addresses a subject we will never conquer, only grow deeper into. As an aid, you can return to the six homilies that I prepared to shed some light on each chapter of the book. These can be found at *sted.org* (our parish website) under the "homilies tab." Come, Holy Spirit!

Maybe, looking back, Lent has been less fruitful than you had hoped when we all gathered for Ash Wednesday. The good news—Holy Week still offers a rich opportunity to make up for lost ground and to deepen our spiritual lives! But, as we have learned, this will not happen unless we choose to respond to the promptings of the Holy Spirit. Growth in faith and the Holy Spirit isn't magic—it takes our response. And, more than anything, this will include choices to offer some time to this end. This week, there are rich, marvelous opportunities to cap off Lent with an experience of growth in the Holy Spirit. Specifically, this Wednesday evening will include our usuallyscheduled Mass at 5:30 pm, followed by an **Agape Meal.** Since the first century of our faith, followers of Jesus have gathered after the Eucharist to continue to share "Agape," the divine love experienced in the breaking of the Bread, with each other, while at the same time sharing a meal. We will do the same. In our gathering, we will enjoy music to praise the God who has given His life to us in the Eucharist (the representation of Christ's death and resurrection that we see across Holy Week) and then hear three parishioners witness to the power of the death and resurrection of Jesus in their lives.

There is still time to register. Please fill out the online form at *sted.org* or put a print registration form in the collection basket. Also, the liturgies of the Sacred Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday (the Easter Vigil) and Easter will all enrich your faith, particularly when taken together as a whole. Why not commit to attending these beautiful liturgies? We can't help but grow and be changed when we experience the Paschal Mystery of Jesus' death and resurrection in this most majestic way!

Those who are shown Love are in turn to show Love to others! Let's be very intentional about our parish mission, "to be an evangelizing community, by faith, with love, in hope," by showing the Love of Christ to all who may join us as visitors during the gatherings for Easter next week. Time and time again, folks say that a hospitable and welcoming church community have made all the difference to those who sought to join a faith family or return to one. Sacred work ahead of us next Sunday, sisters and brothers in Christ! Let us share the love of Christ that we have been shownand let's change lives!
