FROM THE PASTOR:

Happy Easter! Joyeuses Pâques! This is the top, the very most important and solemn celebration of our entire year—Easter: the commemoration of the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead—and the resurrection of our hope for eternity! Because He is our Savior and we have been joined to him, we travel with the confidence of faith, through death to eternal life! He is Risen!

At the **Agape Meal** this last Wednesday evening, we meditated on an “Ancient Homily for Holy Saturday” by an anonymous author, which said, in part, “What is happening? Today there is a great silence over the earth, a great silence, and stillness, a great silence because the King sleeps; the earth was in terror and was still, raised up those who were sleeping from the ages. God has died in the flesh, and the underworld has trembled. . . . The Lord goes in to them holding his victorious weapon, his cross. When Adam, the first created man, sees him, he strikes his breast in terror and calls out to all: ‘My Lord be with you all.’ And Christ in reply says to Adam: ‘And with your spirit.’”

And grasping his hand he raises him up, saying: ‘Awake, O sleeper, and arise from the dead, and Christ shall give you light. . . .’ But arise, let us go hence. The enemy brought you out of the land of paradise; I will reinstate you, no longer in paradise, but on the throne of heaven. I denied you the tree of life, which was a figure, but now I myself am united to you, I who am life. I posted the cherubim to guard you as they would slaves; now I make the cherubim worship you as they would God.”

Today is the celebration of our deliverance from death and the opening of the way to the full, eternal life for which we have been created! All we can do today is...

FALL SILENT, RISE AMAZED!

Beginning next Sunday Evening (Divine Mercy Sunday), our parish will join with Blessed Sacrament Parish in hosting and sponsoring a **Parish Mission, entitled “God’s Healing Love,”** a three-evening event led by the Missionaries of the New Evangelization. Each of the evenings (Sunday, April 24-Tuesday, April 26) will begin with some inspiring praise and worship music at 6:30pm with the Mission presentations beginning around 7:00pm.

What can you expect from the mission? The short answer is: expect the unexpected. We have been preparing for the mission the entirety of the season of Lent, studying and reflecting upon the action of the Holy Spirit in each of our lives. Hopefully you discovered the truth that “the Spirit blows where it will” (John 3:8), that we cannot control, direct, or even anticipate “what good things God has prepared for those who love him” (1 Cor. 2:9), good things that always and forever come from the Holy Spirit.

As I have mentioned before, I have had the opportunity and joy to attend three of these missions over the last six months or so. Each time, I have been overwhelmed, healed, and empowered by the Love of God that is the Holy Spirit. What I have further experienced is that, when “two or three gather together in His Name” (Matthew 18:20), the Spirit’s presence will be a good thing for each of us.

All that is asked is that you come in trust and surrender to an experience of Love that comes from the Holy Spirit. We will discover healing through forgiveness and an outpouring of the Holy Spirit that desires that we be healed, restored, and made whole. My experiences definitely changed my heart—and I am confident that our good God will do the same for you. Come, fall silent before the love of God, and rise amazed!

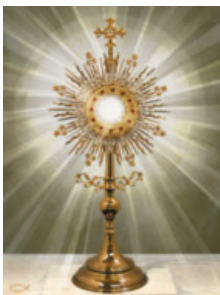

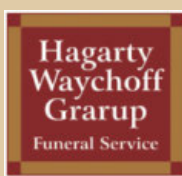
