

FROM THE PASTOR:

First Communion—We are happy and excited to support our young people who are receiving Holy Communion for the first time this weekend! I imagine many of us, even us older ones, can recall when we received Holy Communion for the first time—the joy, specialness and the presence of family and friends that sent a message that this was an important day for us! Only later, in hindsight, can we see how the Eucharist and, in particular, our reception of Holy Communion in the Eucharistic celebration, has changed us. As the early Christians discovered, when it comes to the Eucharist, "you are what you eat." And, consuming the Life of God given to us, we become more who we are to be: Children of God. We pray that the Holy Spirit will continue to fill our children with a desire to come and receive Continued →

the Lord more and more and...as a result, become more like Him. That prayer goes for the rest of us too!

Precious Blood of Christ—We have begun to distribute the Precious Blood of Jesus at weekday Masses, as a way to explore how this goes (since the sharing of the cup has not happened since March of 2020). Expanding that offer to the weekend Masses is a much more complex reality and will take more foresight and planning. But, I trust we will someday offer that opportunity during our weekend Masses. Of course, our faith teaches us that, while a rich experience of the intention of the Lord, that we "eat his body and drink his blood," receiving either of the sacred species (the Body or Blood of Christ) is in fact a receiving of the fullness of the Life of God, which our faith calls "the Body and Blood of Christ." Therefore, reception from the cup is certainly optional and, as in all times, one should refrain from doing so if she or he is sick in such a way that that person could compromise the health of others.

Open Wide the Doors to Christ—In the next stage of the project of our parish family to "Open Wide the Doors to Christ," we will be completing the new drive and additional handicapped-accessible parking spaces between the church and Parish Center (near the elevator entrance). As a result, we are anticipating that the elevator entrance will likely not be useable during the weekend of May 7 & 8 (next week). We apologize to those for whom this will be an inconvenience or, even worse, an obstacle to attending Mass—but it is unavoidable as the project is being completed. In any case, as with all construction projects, there could be late developments regarding the elevator's accessibility, so please check our parish website and social media for late updates as the weekend of May 7 & 8 approaches.

2022 Pastoral Council Elections—As the month of May has arrived, we now will be preparing for our annual practice (disrupted a bit by the pandemic) of elections for our parish's Pastoral Council, as well as the election of a representative to the Cedar Valley Schools Board. Materials for those who might be interested in a nomination will be available at the entrances of our church and through our parish website. Applications are due May 9. Candidate info will be in the 5/15 bulletin. Pastoral Elections are May 21 & 22. I invite the members of our parish family to consider prayerfully if they might be called to serve in this capacity. These representatives offer vital and essential advice and counsel to me as pastor and to the operations of our Cedar Valley Catholic Schools. Members are elected to the Board by their respective parish for a term of three years. The representative is an Ex-Officio Voting Member of the Pastoral Council.

Election Application Process for Prospective Candidates

- Applications are available at the church entrances and on our parish website (*sted.org*).
- Applications to run in the election include a brief personal statement and a photo.
- They are due on Monday, May 9, at 9am.


