The Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Eucharist are
known as the Sacraments of Initiation since by them we become
initiated into full communion with Jesus Christ as a member of his
Church.

In 1943, Pope Pius XII wrote an encyclical letter about the Catholic
Church and titled it "Mystici Corporis" or the Mystical Body of Christ.
Our human bodies have many parts and members to it, but all of these
parts are united as one by the soul which is the principle of life and
unity of our body. Once the soul leaves the body at death, the body
begins to fall apart, or decay and return to the natural elements from
which it was made.

In a similar way, the Church is the body of Christ, with many members
(each human person) but it is unified as a single body by the "soul" or
source of life and unity, in this case, the Holy Spirit. We are first
joined to the body of Christ by means of baptism in which we are filled
with the Holy Spirit, who comes to dwell in our souls as in a temple.

After baptism we can allow the Holy Spirit to live in us and act through
us, accomplishing greater things than Jesus himself did while on earth.
"I say to you, whoever believes in me will do the works that I do, and
will do greater ones than these, because I am going to the Father. If you
ask anything in my name, I will do it. If you love me, you will keep my
commandments. And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another
Advocate, to be with you always, the Spirit of truth" (John 14:12-17).

By receiving Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Communion, we
become "another Christ" capable of doing whatever Christ can do,
because he now dwells in us and has promised to do what we ask in his
name. The power to accomplish great things is not by our own abilities,
but by the power of the Holy Spirit dwelling within us. The Holy Spirit
is God, who is almighty or all-powerful. There is nothing beyond his
ability. All we are called to do is to believe in Jesus Christ. To believe
means the same as to trust in him. The opposite of belief in this sense
could be several things, which are sins against faith.

There is doubt which is a refusal to hold as true what God has revealed
and the Church proposes for belief. Doubt also can happen by
disregarding what God has revealed. Involuntary doubt refers to
hesitation in believing, difficulty in overcoming objections connected
with the faith, or anxiety aroused by the obscurity of faith
(CCC 2088-89). There also is a type of unbelief which refuses to assent
to what God has revealed through the teaching of the Church which
must be held with divine and catholic faith. Schism is the refusal of
submission to the Roman Pontiff or of communion with the members
of the Church subject to him. Pride can get in the way of faith or trust,
when we think that our plan is the best, and even question or challenge
God and his plan. Pride also occurs when we distrust God or when we
expect him to operate according to our plans and our will. Let us have
the attitude of Jesus Christ, who said to the Father, "Not my will, but
yours be done."

*Act of Faith: O My God, I firmly believe that You are one God in three
divine Persons, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. I believe that your divine
Son became man, died for our sins, and that He will come to judge the
living and the dead. I believe these and all the truths which the Holy
Catholic Church teaches, because You have revealed them, who can
neither deceive nor be deceived. Amen.*

In next week's gospel, we celebrate the Ascension of the Lord, Mark
16:15-20.

Holy Spirit Novena begins May 14

The novena in honor of the Holy Spirit is the oldest of all novenas since it was first made at the direction of Our Lord Himself. This is the prototype of all novenas. It commemorates the nine days between the Ascension of Our Lord and the descent of the Holy Spirit on the first Pentecost Sunday. During this time Our Lady and the twelve Apostles prayed in the upper room for the coming of the Paraclete. It is still the only novena officially prescribed by the Church. This Novena begins on the day after the Solemnity of the Ascension, Friday of the 6th Week of Easter, even if the Solemnity of the Ascension is transferred to the 7th Sunday. Pick up a copy of the novena and begin praying the novena on May 14.
