May the peace of the newborn Christ be with you, Merry Christmas to you and all of your family! I pray that the Christ child brings joy to your heart, a removal of fear, and peace of reconciliation and redemption.

There has certainly been a lot going on in our nation and the world and plenty of things to be worried or fearful about. In some ways there were similar fears and worries in first century Judea, around the time of the birth of Christ. The good news is that Jesus is the Lord of time and history



and the God of all. There is nothing happening that is outside of his knowledge, or his loving plan for our salvation. When the angels appeared to announce the coming of Christ, they frequently said to human beings: "Do not be afraid." To Zechariah, the father of John the Baptist, "Do not be afraid, Zechariah, because your prayer has been heard." To Mary the Mother of God, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God." To Joseph, husband of Mary, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary your wife into your home." To the shepherds, "Do not be afraid; for behold, I proclaim to you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. For today in the city of David, a savior has been born for you who is Christ and Lord." (from the beginning of the gospels of Matthew and Luke)

When it came time for the birth of Christ, Caesar Augustus had issued a decree that a census take place and this required the return of everyone to the homeland of their ancestors. For Joseph, this meant going to Bethlehem which is where David was from, and Joseph is directly descended from King David. When they arrived, there was no room for them in the inn, and they had to make do in a poor and smelly stable with animals, with no crib for Jesus but the manger or the box which the animals ate out of. Since Jesus is God and controls every thing that happens, we must conclude that he chose and desired to be born this way, in complete poverty and humility, not being recognized by others except for the shepherds and wise men. It was through these means that God chose to be with us, to experience what we experience, especially those who live in poverty and go without, having to beg for food and assistance, in order to show us that he understands and wants to be with us in compassion.

Sometimes we are tempted to think that things happen to us randomly and often ask, "Why is this happening to me?" Other times we become afraid of what might happen and clamp down in fear trying to control the events of history and our life. In the same way that God foreknew and directed ahead of time all that happened to Jesus, he also directs with love and grace all the events of our lives, each one of us known and wanted by God. The angel or messenger of the Lord says the same words to us, "Do not be afraid." In other words, as St. Paul says, "have no anxiety about anything," (Philippians 4:4), and Jesus himself says, "Do not worry anymore...Do not be afraid any longer, little flock, for your Father is pleased to give you the kingdom... Where your treasure is, there also will your heart be" (Luke 12:32).

In next Sunday's reading, we have the story of Epiphany, the visit of the magi to Jesus, offering him gifts and doing him homage. The theme for World Youth day in Germany in 2005 was "Come Let us Adore Him, referring to the desire of the three kings to give Christ homage, since WYD was in Cologne Germany that year, and the relics of the three kings are contained in the Cathedral of Cologne. To adore Jesus means to love him with all our hearts. Let us pray with St. Francis de Sales: Do not look forward to the changes and chances of this life with fear. Rather, look to them with full confidence that, as they arise, God to whom you belong will in his love enable you to profit by them. He has guided you thus far in life. Do you but hold fast to His dear hand, and He will lead you safely through all trials. Whenever you cannot stand, He will carry you lovingly in his arms. Do not look forward to what may happen tomorrow. The same Eternal Father who takes care of you today will take care of you tomorrow, and every day of your life. Either he will shield you from suffering or He will give you unfailing strength to bear it. Be at peace then, and put aside all useless thoughts, all vain dreads and all anxious imaginations.




