May the peace of Christ be with you, During this week we will have our second session for the Synod gathering on Thursday, January 20 at SS. Peter and Paul Church in Blue Earth beginning at 6pm with prayer in the church. Pope Francis wants to hear from as many people as possible about their experience of Christ in the Church and how we could make better the proclamation of the good news of salvation that Christ brings to each of us in our particular situation. Salvation is a word that is



derived from the word for "healing" and so it means the complete healing of our body and soul, mind and spirit. There are five kinds of healing that Jesus gives to us: 1) physical healing, which means healing of physical illnesses, diseases, and wounds, 2) emotional healing which heals us of difficulties with sadness, anger, lust, anxiety, fear, etc. 3) intellectual healing which heals us of inner lies or vows that we have made and accepted but which cause great harm. Jesus says, "I have come that you may know the truth, and the truth will set you free." 4) relational healing, which by means of forgiveness and reconciliation heals our relationships with others that have been broken or harmed by sinful words or actions, rash judgments or omissions 5) spiritual healing by which our relationship with God is restored and we receive his infinite, unconditional, abiding love for us.

During this year the Lord is inviting us to devote more time to prayer and to go deeper into our relationship with Jesus by means of listening to him in guiet prayer. The Fourth Section of the Catechism is on prayer and is reputed to have been written by Fr. Jean Corbon, OP. Fr. Corbon states, "the most fruitful human activity is to be able to receive God." Of all the things that we could be doing, the most fruitful is receiving God in prayer. This is a shocking statement, meaning that prayer is more fruitful than harvesting a crop or constructing a building or anything else in between. So often we get caught in what Dom Chatard calls the "heresy of activism" in his book, The Soul of the Apostolate. This is the belief that we need to be as busy doing as many things as possible in order to accomplish much. But it all becomes fruitless activity if we do not have prayer, or if we forego prayer in order to accomplish more things. This is contrary to the words of Jesus in the gospel, "I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever remains in me and I win him will bear much fruit, because without me you can do nothing" (John 15:5). When the apostles were fishing in the boat without Jesus, they worked hard all night and caught nothing. When Jesus came to them, he said, "throw your net into the deep," and even though they protested, they obeyed and caught such a large amount of fish that their nets were in danger of tearing and their boats sinking. Rather than trying to do everything yourselves, you are called to "commit your way to the Lord; trust in him and he will act" Psalm 37:5. Another way of saying it is "surrender to God, and he will do everything for you." We are dependent on God for everything, but we are constantly tempted to believe that we are in control or that we can accomplish things apart from Christ.

In next Sunday's gospel, we have the beginning of the gospel of Luke Chapters 1:1-4 and 4:14-21. This gives us the reason for which Luke wrote his gospel and then skips over the nativity stories to go the first preaching of Jesus after his baptism and temptation in the desert. These other readings from Luke are read in the season of Advent and Christmas, and Lent. There are two reasons Luke wrote his gospel: 1) to write down in order the narrative of the events that have been fulfilled among us, which means the words and actions of Jesus Christ. 2) "so that you may receive the certainty of the teachings you have received." He is speaking to Theophilus which is a name that means "beloved of God" and so it could refer to every one of us.

## Reflexión Española



#### 16 de enero de 2022 2º Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

Con la fiesta de la Epifanía y el Bautismo del Señor se cierra el Tiempo de Navidad, que siempre es precedido por el Adviento. Ahora, comenzamos el Tiempo Ordinario. Serán siete domingos de este corto periodo, que termina el día anterior al Miércoles de Ceniza. La segunda etapa de este Tiempo es más larga, da comienzo después del domingo de Pentecostés y termina hasta el sábado antes del primer domingo de Adviento. ¿Para qué sirve a los cristianos este Tiempo Ordinario? ¿Qué nos pide la Liturgia de este tiempo? Pues, es muy sencillo, nos pide meditar en el misterio de Cristo. En su invitación de participar en su Reino con alegría y compromiso verdadero. La Iglesia tiene diversidad de carismas, donde podemos entregarnos al servicio de los demás.

Por ejemplo, hoy el Evangelio nos invita a participar junto con María y Jesús en las bodas de Caná. Y es ahí en esa boda, donde Jesús hace su primer milagro a petición de su Madre María. El diálogo de ambos viene a ser a causa de la falta de vino. Por lo tanto, los novios estaban en apuros por esta razón. Este relato es muy profundo, el hecho de que Jesús participa en la boda, tiene como significado la boda de Dios con la humanidad, que más adelante será la Sangre de Jesús derramada para la salvación de la humanidad. "*Alegrémonos, regocijémonos démosle honor y gloria, porque han llegado las bodas del Cordero" (Apocalipsis 19,7)*. También, el profeta en la primera lectura lo pone claro: "*No te llamaran más* '*Abandonada', ni a tu tierra 'Desolada', sino que te llamaran* '*Mi Preferida' y a tu tierra 'Desposada'. Porque Yavé se complacerá en ti y tu tierra tendrá un esposo*" (Isaías 62,4).




#### St. Vincent de Paul – Helping Friends in Need
