Please continue to keep in your prayers all those who are ill,
especially those who are suffering from the coronavirus. We are
praying that this pandemic comes to an end soon. Thanks for your
prayers.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church defines prayer as the raising
of one's mind and heart to God or the requesting of good things from
God (CCC 2559). Humility is the essential virtue for prayer as we are
not demanding things from God, but humbly placing ourselves in his
presence, aware of our great need and of our weakness. Jesus says in
the gospel of John to the Samaritan woman at the well, "If you knew
the gift of God, you would have asked him, and he would have given
you living water" (John 4:10). The gift of God is compared to water
from a fountain that continually springs forth. Jesus is longing for us
to come to him in prayer so that he can fill our souls with this living
water, the love of the Holy Spirit. In Jeremiah, the Lord compares the
searching for happiness in our soul in ways other than prayer as
trying to find water in a broken cistern. "They have forsaken me, the
fountain of living waters, and hewn out cisterns for themselves,
broken cisterns that can hold no water" Jer. 2:13. In our culture today
especially, we turn to many things as we look for satisfaction in our
hearts, or peace in our souls. This takes many forms, such as social
media, television, and conversations of gossip with others. We notice
a certain restlessness in our hearts as these things leave us feeling
empty and unfulfilled. We are made for God and our hearts will not
rest until we rest in him. Jesus invites us to prayer, "Come to me, all
you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my
yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am meek and humble of
heart; and you will find rest for yourselves, for my yoke is easy and
my burden light" (Matthew 11:28-30). If you have fallen out of the
habit of daily time for prayer let us begin again, as I will make a
commitment to one hour of prayer a day for you.

In next Sunday's gospel, Luke 4:21-30, Jesus continues to speak in
the synagogue in Nazareth after reading from the prophet Isaiah and
saying "this reading is fulfilled in your hearing." The people of
Nazareth know Jesus as he has lived his whole life there with nothing
extraordinary happening. Now he is inviting them to greater faith in
him as the Messiah and ultimately the Son of God. Their hearts are
closed to this type of faith as they do not expect anything great from
Jesus, "Isn't this the son of Joseph?" they say. Jesus describes how
healing was given through Elijah and Elisha not to the people of
Israel, but to foreigners and non-Israelites. They grow angry and try
to throw him off the brow of the hill and kill him. Do we bring our
needs and concerns to Jesus? Do we pray with faith in confidence in
Jesus that he can and will answer our prayers, or do we listen to the
voice of the enemy who says "this is impossible" or "you will have
to take care of things yourself." Let us pray for greater faith and say
"Jesus, I trust in you."

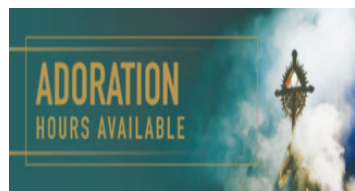

Reflexión Española

23 de enero de 2022
3er Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario



“*Canten al Señor un cántico nuevo, hombres de toda la tierra, canten al Señor. Hay brillo y esplendor en su presencia, y en su templo, belleza y majestad*” (Salmo 95, 1,67). La esperanza de Jesús para su pueblo y para toda la humanidad empieza aquí con este pasaje de la Sagrada Escritura. Un mundo nuevo y diverso, sin divisiones ni estatus sociales que dividen y matan. Por el contrario una tierra redimida y armoniosa, sin tinieblas ni miedos. Esta sigue siendo la esperanza de Jesús por medio de su Iglesia, que siempre, domingo a domingo, nos invita a acoger el Evangelio de Cristo. 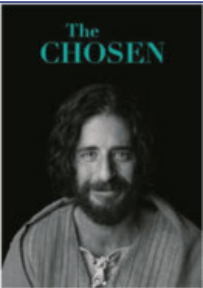
St. Vincent de Paul – Helping Friends in Need

St. Thomas Aquinas | January 28

One of the most famous members of the Dominican Order, St. Thomas Aquinas (1225 – 1274) is well-known by many for his theological work, “*The Summa Theologiae*.” Born in Italy, his mother wanted him to become a Benedictine and had high hopes that he would eventually become abbot of Monte Cassino, where he spent much of his youth. To change his vocation, she had him kidnapped by his brothers on his way to Paris at the age of 19. He spent two years in their captivity. Despite this, nothing could shake him from his vocation to become a Dominican priest and he was eventually released. Once free, he went to Paris and then to Cologne, where he finished his studies with Albert the Great.

His greatest contribution to the Catholic Church is his writings. The unity, harmony, and continuity of faith and reason, of revealed and natural human knowledge, encompasses his writings. The *Summa Theologiae*, his last and, unfortunately, uncompleted work, deals with the whole of Catholic theology.

The patron saint of teachers, theologians and students, St. Thomas Aquinas died in 1274. His life and the impact he had on the whole Church, however, remains alive today.
