As I read of Laura's experiences and reflections during the season, I was moved and aided in reflecting on my own. Thanks, Coach, for staying with us all the way through the desert and into the Garden.



On Monday of this week, someone left me an Easter basket! Super nice, huh? Of course, a rush of childhood memories accompanied the gift, which is such a great gift at any time, prompted by anything or anybody.

However, that visit to my past came only after being enthralled in the present for a few minutes Monday morning. This Easter basket was amazingly unique, unlike any I'd ever seen. Unwrapping it in my office, I literally gasped as it finally came to my view. I was not only surprised that someone saw to it that I had a basket this Easter, but also amazed by the basket itself! Remember the first time you heard some particularly superb piece of music and a big WOW! or OH! rose up within you? It was like that for me on Monday. Alone in my office I gasped and said aloud, "Wow!" This basket was so unique and so beautiful! *Awestruck* would be the perfect description for my reaction.

As Easter baskets go, this one was the smallest I'd ever seen. It could be held fully in the palm of my hand. And well, it really wasn't even a basket, but rather more like a nest, softly knit together of yarn and pliant in its boundaries. And its colors matched the tactile softness, understated and very much of nature. The few pieces of candy within were few, but each one so much more mattered, each one valuable in itself.

In the middle of its carefully assembled treats was a small, egg-shaped chocolate (I presume), wrapped in the metallic wrapping you find in Easter baskets. But, this chocolate had an image of Jesus Christ on it. Striking!

It was all so beautiful! And that beauty worked an Easter project within me. For just a couple of minutes, I was raised up beyond any darkness, any disappointments, any frustrations, any focus on the limits of this existence on earth. Without any words spoken, my heart and soul heard a great message: "God shall prevail. All shall be well!" For the rest of that day, my mind kept going back to that good news, the news proclaimed in words when we say, "Christ is Risen."

Many years ago, I read a reflection piece that asserted that a major calling of Christians is to bring beauty into people's everyday lives. I was skeptical of that claim. However, over the years I have come to believe it's truth.

Here's why: beauty is a glimpse of God's heart. It lifts us up. It calls us upwards in every way. It reminds us that there is something greater than the darkness we encounter here on this earthly journey. It turns our attention from the power of darkness toward the assurance of the victory of the Light. It incites us to choose: "I'll serve the Light. I'll trust the Light. Sin, mine or others', has no power over me!"

Others create music, write poems, compose beautiful letters, design beautiful rooms, masterfully choose "the perfect gift" for others. Perhaps the greatest beauty is simple kindness.

Create some beauty. You never know the impact it might have on someone's life!

GOSPEL REFLECTION

2ND SUNDAY OF EASTER (DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY)

What a wonderful joy fills us today as we ponder the inexhaustible mercy of God. "Mercy is the heart of God," Pope Francis tells us. The image of a heart has been used to point to the very life source of a person as it is the organ that allows life to flow through our veins and sustain us. Mercy is the heart of God. Imagine this dynamic, powerful, compassionate, piercing, embracing, loving, propelling, penetrating, absorbing, and enveloping, transforming presence of God flowing into the very depth of our souls. It is God's mercy that allows blood to flow through our veins. It is God's mercy that forms every atom of our being and leads us to what is true. God's mercy reveals all superficiality and falsehood, and lays bare all distortions, empty promises, weakness, and sin.

"Mercy is the force that reawakens us to new life and instills in us the courage to look to the future with hope," Pope Francis continues. God's all forgiving, compassionate love is with us. When we finally believe and accept that Christ's resurrected transfigured presence resides with us, we then find within us a strong confidence to accept life's imperfections and disappointments and move on. Every day is a new adventure in new life. God leaves the past behind and opens doors to the future. It doesn't matter how many mistakes we made yesterday. All that matters is what we do tomorrow and what we learn along the way. It is so easy to remain tethered and mired in the past, but there is no need to do so. God is all about tomorrow and the work God has yet to do in our lives.

Mercy gives birth to hope. Hope for the greatest of sinners and hope for the worst of disasters. There is nothing God cannot do and nothing God cannot fashion. After all, everything we know and treasure was once nothing, and look what God did with the nothing God had! The resurrected Christ stands before us with nail marks in his wrists and wounds on his body as a testament that not even injustice, suffering and death can trample over and destroy God's mercy. What have we to fear? Why do we keep ourselves from peace? Our lack of faith prevents us from going forward and fully receiving the holiness God desires to breathe upon us. 
