

A Heavenly Weekend

This weekend, the Corpus Christi community is filled with joy! Our son, Aaron Bohr, S.J., has returned home to us, now as Father Aaron Bohr! Together we celebrate with him his Mass of Thanksgiving, in which he and we thank God for bringing Aaron to this point in his life and ministry.



As we celebrate together, let's pause to recognize that the earliest years of Father Aaron's formation for his new role in the Church universal took place right here at Corpus Christi in the years of Aaron's childhood. Here he prayed with us. Here he made friends. Here he watched us and listened to us. Here he grew in his earliest days of wisdom and love of the Lord. The fact that, that Holy Spirit carried out such wondrous work right here in years past can bring us to a greater confidence that, surely, that same Spirit will work wonders in the years of our future as well! Perhaps we can go forward better aware that even the little things we do for and with one another make a difference for all of eternity.

But, before we take our next step into that future, I'd like to speak about one week ago. You may be aware that I traveled to Milwaukee to represent you at the ordination of then Deacon Aaron and his four Jesuit ordination classmates. Even though I went representing you, all weekend I couldn't help but wish that you could have experienced the event with me. It was all so wonderful and inspiring, all the way from the Saturday ordination Mass at Gesu Church on the campus of Marquette University, to the gathering of Father's family and friends Saturday evening, and continuing into Father's first Mass at Gesu Church on Sunday morning.

I'll be forever grateful to Father Aaron for the honor he gave me by inviting me to proclaim the Gospel reading at Sunday's Mass and to distribute Holy Communion at his side. Following Communion, I took several moments just to take in all that I had experienced that whole weekend and how wonderful it was to sit right next to Father Aaron for those last few minutes. I'm so glad I took the time to notice the wonder and beauty while still there so that I could take the clear memories with me after it all drew to a close.

It was quite impressive to see the sizeable number of Jesuits present for the ordination. I'd estimate that there were between 150 and 200, perhaps even more. I lived with the Jesuits in Vilnius, Lithuania for a few months in 2000. So, it was wonderful to be among Jesuits for a day all these years later.

A very special treat was to look to the altar and see there, not only a beaming Father Aaron, but right next to him Archbishop Hebda, the ordaining bishop for this year's ordinands. I must mention that our archbishop was at his best, lovingly leading us in prayer, sharing with us a fantastically powerful homily, and (of course) inserting his usual good humor.

I know that many people were deeply touched and will never forget that weekend, including myself and, I'd imagine, Father Aaron.

I close with a huge thank you to Richard, Gail, and Jessica for the gift of Aaron. And a big thanks, as well, to this wonderful, inspiring community of Corpus Christi! We give thanks to God together this weekend. I only wish our celebration could have begun last weekend in Milwaukee! That was pretty close to Heaven! (You know I had to add that comment.)

Congratulations, Father Aaron. You now belong to the whole world. But keep coming back home to Corpus Christi parish. You have a home here!

GOSPEL REFLECTION

THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST

Jesus went to those most in need. He forgave the sinner, ate with the outcast, defended, and fed those who were poor and hungry. He worked for true justice, risked being unpopular, willingly accepted suffering and death, and always stayed connected with his Abba, Father. Jesus also consistently reminded folks that God's compassion, love, and mercy trump everything, even the law. This is the Christ that the Eucharist calls us to be. As we look around our churches, our towns and cities, and our world, there are many people who need to see the face and body of Christ. Some of those most in need may be right within our families. But it is always in the poorest of the poor and those most vulnerable that we find the greatest need. There are many who cannot function on their own. When the gift of the Eucharistic Christ takes root in our hearts, we can more readily see the face of Christ in others.

Many people are vulnerable. Highest on that list are the homeless. They show us the face of Christ. Whatever the cause, to have no place to go and no place to call home takes a toll on the human spirit. For Jesus when there were hungry people, they were fed. God asks us to do the same ... feed people. There are many who are hungry physically, emotionally, and spiritually. Gifted by the Eucharistic presence of Christ, we can bring them Christ. Who are the hungry around us and how can we feed them?

When someone is hurting, you comfort them. When someone is hungry, you feed them. When someone needs clothes, you provide them. When someone is cold, you warm them. When someone is in prison, you visit them. With over a million people who are homeless and over a quarter of them children, it is important to ask the question, "why?" and strategize for ways to lessen or alleviate the problem. Nevertheless, we are not off the hook for responding to the immediate needs that present themselves at our doors. Whether a person's current station in life is self-imposed or the result of being victimized, they are sacred vessels. We cannot lock the door and send them away and still believe we bear the Eucharistic presence of Christ. It doesn't work like that. ©LPi


