Diving In!

Most of us would agree that we, in general, should live according to the ways and teachings of Jesus of Nazareth as found in the Holy Gospels. But, what about when those teachings make us uncomfortable? What about when following them would cost us dearly? What about when the desires of God differ from our own?

In other words, what if we'd remove the words "in general" from our first statement? Following Jesus' teaching and example "in general" is kind of cheap, isn't it? It is the *specifics* and the "*always*" that are demanding.

Saint Paul wrote to the Christians in Galatia that we are created for freedom. But, before we go out to the world using that line alone, let's gather up our sense of integrity and take with us the next sentence: "But do not use this freedom as an opportunity for the flesh, but rather to serve one another through love."

Paul calls us to be free from all else, that you might be always free to love one another: free from slavery to "what you've always done"; from what you've always had; from what you've seen so far so that you can trust what you shall one day see.

Integrity of truly Christian faith is found only by "diving in" to a brand new life, a future defined and shaped by and for the Kingdom of God. This means allowing our entire future to be built upon and for that Kingdom and its ways, not trying to add God's Kingdom onto our own kingdom.

The Spirit that will lead you is like the wind, according to the Holy Scriptures. You cannot know from where it came nor to where it is going. You must simply trust the Spirit of God, trust it enough to jump before you can see it and surrender before you can hold it.

Who of us has yet reached such a level of faith? I'd guess the answer is probably, "none of us."

Yet together we can practice such faith, in order that we might grow closer to it. Let us practice using our freedom in Christ to serve one another in love, to serve all people with love, both the righteous and the unrighteous, our friends and our enemies.

Let us *together* ... dive!

ABOUT OUR MISSION TRIP



This June a group of Corpus Christi youth (all recently Confirmed) travelled to St. Louis for a mission trip. Our host organization, Youthworks, scheduled our service opportunities and ran our morning & evening programming. Youthworks also set up the host site where our group (and 4 other churches from around the country) stayed Sunday-Friday morning.

The week began with some site-seeing and team-building, both on the way down (a great lake in Iowa) and in St. Louis itself. Our youth also seemed to begin the week in site-seeing or tourist mode... but their transition and growth was very obvious to us adult leaders. We asked the question (during our small group time on Tues.) of what it meant to be a missionary on behalf of Corpus Christi, and the youth began reflecting on the idea.

I also had referred to them as 'kids' early in the week, and told them I hoped to see them differently (at least as 'teens') by the end. We were happy to see that, by the time Thursday night came, we had a group of very hard-working young missionaries with us—not children anymore.

We worked alongside some great organizations in St. Louis that have been working for years to serve those in need. But we also saw some very stark examples of the extreme poverty—both the poverty financially, but also spiritual poverty in places. I think the second kind—like meeting young children who had already been pulled into gang life—was the harder part to see.

Yet our young people responded to each challenge with love and hard work, drawing on strength from one another. That support for each other often came as laughter, through inside jokes, or as little acts of kindness in the sweltering heat. Sometimes it was unspoken moments of solidarity, reflecting on what we'd seen during the music-filled rides through the city.

We asked the students on the final night to reflect on the two most important questions for a missionary—how has this experience changed *you*, and how did you change or impact this place? Their answers—insightful, honest, sometimes raw—will stick with me for a long time, as one of the most powerful moments.

In the weeks to come, we'll share a few letters from our youth—their reflections on what they did in St. Louis. If you know these youth or see them around, I encourage you to ask them about the trip. Let them know if you were praying for them. Listen to their stories of mission, celebrate or commiserate with them. And remind them that at Corpus Christi, we never serve alone.
