GOSPEL MEDITATION

July 31, 2022 18th Sunday in Ordinary Time

What makes us feel secure? Many people look to tangible forms of security that will safeguard their livelihood and prepare for their future. We tend to associate security with things: the accumulation of goods and possessions, retirement funds, savings accounts, and substantial incomes. While acquiring these promises a life with less anxiety and worry, we actually find ourselves more preoccupied and consumed with their growth and preservation. We worry more! We can easily become quasihoarders, consumed with obtaining more tangible crutches. Our minds and hearts are always restless, and we never seem to be at peace.

Why do we so easily give our self-worth, value, and sense of security over to things? God certainly does not deny us the pursuit of a productive and enjoyable life but where do we draw the line? A sense of well-being and happiness can easily get deferred to sometime "in the future" while we continue to wrestle with the toils of today. There is no guarantee that there will be an earthly tomorrow and all of the frenzy we bring to securing our state in life will be for naught. When we are called from this world, will we even know where to begin to look for the tranquility and repose our souls so desperately need?

We cannot be hoarders, pursuers of vanity, or greedy. They just don't work as they are too dependent on things that can fall apart. Rather than always feeling the need for more, we need to learn how to be grateful for what we have. By learning to look inward we can learn how to live lives of faithful service to others. "Happiness can only be achieved by looking inward and learning to enjoy whatever life has, and this requires transforming greed into gratitude (St. John Chrysostom)." We all need to be good stewards of what has been entrusted to our care. Emergency Fund for Refugee Families

This summer, the Corpus Christi Social Justice
Committee's three <u>Good Neighbor</u> teams began working with
refugee families resettling in the Twin Cities. Sponsored by
<u>Arrive Ministries</u>, Good Neighbor volunteers commit to
connecting with newly placed families on a regular basis for one
year. Ours are <u>Team Ecuador</u>, <u>Team Afghanistan</u> and <u>Team</u>
Congo, based on the countries of origin of our families.

In addition to our normal team interactions with the families, we invite all parishioners to join us in establishing an **Emergency Fund** to help deal with unforeseen expenses that can crop up. For example, one of our families had its car break down, leading to an expensive towing bill.

Our idea is to provide the funds primarily in the form of interest-free loans to be paid back over time. Thus, the fund could be self-perpetuating and available to other families down the road.

Our initial goal for the fund is **\$3,000**, or \$1,000 for each family. We have about \$450 so far. ABOUT OUR MISSION TRIP

Letters from our Youth

Hi, I'm Max, and I went on the summer 2022 mission trip to St Louis, Missouri this June.



We went to different service sites, where we did volunteer work

ranging from helping people organize their garages to helping out with a summer camp for kids with nowhere else to be. We spent half of the day, from about 9:30 to 2:30 doing volunteer work, then the second half of the day going to places in St Louis like the Gateway Arch and Union Station.

For service the first day, we helped a woman named Gloria with her house. We helped paint and clean out her garage and basement. She gave us snacks, and let us eat in her basement and cool down there. I didn't realize it at that moment, but it was her way of giving us something back.

The second day we spent the morning at a shelter for abused women, then spent the afternoon helping a woman named Angelica clean out her garage. We learned that she hadn't had the motivation to do these things before, but just knowing we were coming to help gave her motivation.

The third day we spent the morning helping out at a summer camp for kids who don't have anything else to do over the summer, many of whom walk by themselves. It took very little for those kids to absolutely light up. We spent the afternoon helping out at a food shelf and thrift store, sorting food and helping to tag clothing.

The fourth day we started out at the women's shelter in the morning, moving boxes out of the basement so the floor could be done in there. Then at Waymaker's Chapel, a church specifically meant for disabled people, we helped to break down boxes, and put cans in a pantry. None of the projects felt that big or important, but we were told that these little things still made a lot of a difference.

We didn't manage to fix everything wrong in St Louis, or even do all of the work that needs to be done, but we weren't supposed to. We weren't there to "fix everyone else's problems," we were there to help them get started, get to a better place where they could figure things out for themselves.

It wasn't all volunteering though. We got to go to some places just for fun, like the gateway arch and union station. My favorite place we went to was the City Museum.

I'm glad that I spent the entire time around kind people, and that I got to work alongside people that I got along well with. We'd created a very strong bond in the end, and are planning to keep in touch. I'm very thankful for everyone who made this journey possible, from donating money to donating time. Thank you.


