

A message from

Fr. Mark Murphy

Dear Parishioners,

Today we begin a new liturgical year with the 1st Sunday of Advent. In our first reading we hear the Prophet Isaiah speaking to the Lord:

*Return for the sake of your servants, the tribes of your heritage.
Oh, that you would rend the heavens and come down.*

Prior to this line Isaiah recognizes we have wandered from the ways of the Lord and our hearts are hardened. Therefore, Isaiah asks God to come down from heaven. This is what Advent is about: preparing for the coming of the Son of God at the end of time, preparing to celebrate the coming of the Son of God in history, and preparing for God's coming into our daily lives. In today's Gospel we are instructed to be vigilant as we prepare for Jesus' coming: *What I say to you, I say to all: Watch.*

This Advent I invite us to prepare for Jesus' coming especially through a form of watchful prayer recommended by both Pope Francis and Archbishop Jackels. At St. Jude Church we offer Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament (Eucharistic Adoration) on Thursdays after the 7:00 AM Mass until 6:00 PM. During Advent we will also offer Eucharistic Adoration on Monday evenings. Eucharistic Adoration is a form of watchful prayer. At Eucharistic Adoration we present ourselves before Jesus who is truly present in the Blessed Sacrament. We watch our Lord in the Host exposed on the altar. Maybe we reflect on how much we are loved by Jesus, maybe we express our love to Jesus, or maybe we sit and rest with Jesus after coming from the busyness of the outside world. Eucharistic Adoration flows from the Mass when God rends the heavens and comes down to us. At Eucharistic Adoration we have an opportunity to watch the Lord who has come. We place ourselves more in union with Him, so we are better able to watch for Jesus, and respond to Him, in other areas of our lives.

We are in need of more people to prayerfully watch the Lord at Eucharistic Adoration on Thursdays. This may be the way the Lord is calling you to watch this Advent. I want to expand this ministry of prayer at St. Jude. If you are able to commit to regularly praying before Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, please contact parishioner Andy Malosh at aj.malosh@gmail.com. If you cannot commit, at least come sometime and prayerfully watch the Lord.

How do you plan to be more watchful for Jesus' coming this Advent?


Leader: For all who are burdened with guilt; may they turn to God and come to realize the boundlessness of God's extravagant forgiveness. We pray to the Lord.



When it finally dawns on us that we have wandered far away from where we need to be, and lost our attentiveness and focus, we will wonder how this all happened. We may even try to put the onus on God and blame God for a lack of involvement or presence. We are the ones, who through our own choice, put the distance in our relationship and lost touch. Now it's time to come back and perk ourselves up a bit!

Leader: Loving God, open our hearts in love, our hands in sharing and make us ready for the coming of that kingdom where you live and reign with the Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.

All: Our Father who art in heaven...

Spiritual Communion

Those who are unable to share in the Eucharist may make an act of spiritual communion, expressing their desire for the sacrament.

As Pope St. John Paul II reminded us, using the words of St. Teresa of Jesus: "When you do not receive communion and you do not attend Mass, you can make a spiritual communion, which is a most beneficial practice; by it the love of God will be greatly impressed on you." The following prayer, by St. Alphonsus Liguori, may be used to make an act of spiritual communion:

All: My Jesus, I believe that you are present in the Blessed Sacrament. I love you above all things and I desire you with all my heart. Since I cannot now receive you sacramentally, I ask you to come spiritually into my heart. I embrace you as if you were already in my heart and unite myself to you completely. Please do not let me ever be separated from you.

Concluding Rite

Leader: Let us pray: Hasten to the aid of your faithful people who call upon you, O Lord, we pray, and graciously give strength in their human weakness, so that, being dedicated to you in complete sincerity, they may find gladness in your remedies both now and in the life to come. Through Christ our Lord.

All make the Sign of the Cross as the leader prays:

Leader: + May the Lord bless us, protect us from all evil, and bring us to everlasting life.

All: Amen.
