

A message from

Fr. Mark Murphy



Dear Parishioners,

On the Fourth Sunday of Advent, the focus of the Scriptures at Mass shifts from our expectation of Jesus coming again in glory and majesty to our celebration of the Jesus' first coming in history. One of the prayers at Mass this weekend mentions the building anticipation by the people of Israel for Jesus' coming in history with the words "the oracles of the prophets foretold him".

Our first reading provides an "oracle of the prophets." In this reading, the Prophet Nathan receives a message from the Lord for King David. David desires to build a more fitting dwelling for the ark of God than the tent in which it has always resided. The ark is the holiest object for the people of ancient Israel, the dwelling place of God. It is near the ark the priests offer sacrifices. Nathan's message from God is in response to David's desire to build a dwelling for the ark.

For Christians, the high point of this message is when the Lord through Nathan provides this oracle for David: "I will raise up your heir after you, sprung from your loins, and I will make his kingdom firm. I will be a father to him, and he shall be a son to me."

In today's Gospel, the angel Gabriel references this oracle to a virgin named Mary, telling her she will conceive and bear a son, and "the Lord God will give him the throne of David his father, and he will rule over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end."

King David wanted a fitting place for the ark, a fitting place for priests to offer sacrifices to God near the ark. The Prophet Nathan calls David to something greater. This first reading references a king, a priest, and a prophet, and in the coming of Jesus, we see all three references fulfilled.

Jesus is foretold as king who rules as the one and only king of Israel, God. Jesus is foretold as one who will be called holy, holy; like a perfect priest who offers Himself to God for own holiness. And finally, Jesus will be a prophet who calls others back to our common God and Father.

As we prepare to celebrate the coming of Christ at Christmas, let us be fully prepared to meet Christ by serving Him as king, striving for holiness from Him as priest, and responding to his call as prophet.

Leader: Let us pray: Pour forth, we beseech you, O Lord, your grace into our hearts, that we, to whom the Incarnation of Christ your Son was made known by the message of an Angel, may by his Passion and Cross be brought to the glory of his Resurrection. Who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.

All: Amen.

Prayer of the Faithful

Leader: Gabriel assured Mary that nothing will be impossible for God and so we confidently bring our needs before the Lord, no matter how difficult they seem to us.

Leader: For the Church; may she be like Mary, totally open to God's will. We pray to the Lord.

All: Lord, hear our prayer. (Repeat after each petition.)

Leader: For our world; may all nations reject the use of weapons of war as ways to settle disagreements or to assert power. We pray to the Lord.

Leader: For those who find the holiday season difficult to endure because of loss or loneliness; may they find comfort and hope in the Incarnation. We pray to the Lord.

Leader: For leaders responsible for making decisions about the COVID-19 vaccines; may they be empowered by the strength of the Holy Spirit. We pray to the Lord.

Leader: For those discerning a call to serve Christ as a priest, deacon or in the consecrated life; may their faithful response be, "Behold, I come to do your will, O Lord". We pray to the Lord.

Leader: For each of us; may the people we touch see the goodness and generosity of God in our works of charity and compassion. We pray to the Lord.

Leader: Come Lord, and bless our world with your peace. Come and bless our families with your grace. Come and bless our hearts with your love. Who lives and reigns for ever and ever. Amen.

Blessing of a Christmas Tree

*When all have gathered, a suitable song may be sung.
The lights on the tree are off.*

The leader makes the sign of the cross, and all reply "Amen."

The leader may greet those present in the following words:

Let us glorify Christ our light, who brings salvation and peace into our midst, now and forever.

R/. Amen.

In the following or similar words, the leader prepares those present for the blessing:

My brothers and sisters, amidst signs and wonders Christ Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea: his birth brings joy to our hearts and enlightenment to our minds. With this tree, decorated and adorned, may we welcome Christ among us; may its lights guide us to the perfect light.

One of those present or the leader reads a text of sacred Scripture, for example, Titus 3:4-7 or Ezekiel 17:22-24.

A reading from the Book of the prophet Ezekiel...

The Word of the Lord.

R/. Thanks be to God.

The intercessions are then said. The leader says:

Let us ask God to send his blessing upon us and upon this sign of our faith in the Lord.

R/. Lord, give light to our hearts.

That this tree of lights may remind us of the tree of glory on which Christ accomplished our salvation, let us pray to the Lord.

R/. Lord, give light to our hearts.

That the joy of Christmas may always be in our homes, let us pray to the Lord.

R/. Lord, give light to our hearts.

That the peace of Christ may dwell in our hearts and in the world, let us pray to the Lord.

R/. Lord, give light to our hearts.

After the intercessions the leader invites all present to say the Lord's Prayer.

Our Father who art in Heaven...

The leader says the prayer with hands joined:

**Lord our God,
we praise you for the light of creation:
the sun, the moon, and the stars of the night.
We praise you for the light of Israel:
the Law, the prophets, and the wisdom of the Scriptures.**

**We praise you for Jesus Christ, your Son:
he is Emmanuel, God-with-us, the Prince of Peace,
who fills us with the wonder of your love.**

**Lord God,
let your blessing come upon us
as we illumine this tree.
May the light and cheer it gives
be a sign of the joy that fills our hearts.
May all who delight in this tree
come to the knowledge and joy of salvation.
We ask this through Christ our Lord.
R/. Amen.**

The lights of the tree are then illuminated.

The leader concludes the rite by signing himself or herself with the sign of the cross and saying:

May the God of glory fill our hearts with peace and joy, now and forever.

R/. Amen

The blessing concludes with a verse from "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel":

O come, thou dayspring, come and cheer
our spirits by thine advent here;
disperse the gloomy clouds of night
and death's dark shadow put to flight.
Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel
shall come to thee, O Israel.

Blessing of a Christmas Manger or Nativity Scene

All make the sign of the cross as the leader says:

Our help is in the name of the Lord.

R/. Who made heaven and earth.

One of those present or the leader reads a text of sacred Scripture, for example, Luke 2:1-8 or Isaiah 7:10-15.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke.

In those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that the whole world should be enrolled. This was the first enrollment, when Quirinius was governor of Syria. So all went to be enrolled, each to his own town. And Joseph too went up from Galilee from the town of Nazareth to Judea, to the city of David that is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and family of David, to be enrolled with Mary, his betrothed, who was with child. While they were there, the time came for her to have her child, and she gave birth to her firstborn son. She wrapped him in swaddling clothes and laid him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn. Now there were shepherds in that region living in the fields and keeping the night watch over their flock.

R/. Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

The leader prays with hands joined:

**God of every nation and people,
from the very beginning of creation
you have made manifest your love:
when our need for a Savior was great
you sent your Son to be born of the Virgin Mary.
To our lives he brings joy and peace,
justice, mercy, and love.**

**Lord,
bless all who look upon this manger;
may it remind us of the humble birth of Jesus,
and raise our thoughts to him,
who is God-with-us and Savior of all,
who lives and reigns forever and ever.
R/. Amen.**

Spiritual Communion

Those who are unable to share in the Eucharist may make an act of spiritual communion, expressing their desire for the sacrament.

As Pope St. John Paul II reminded us, using the words of St. Teresa of Jesus: "When you do not receive communion and you do not attend Mass, you can make a spiritual communion, which is a most beneficial practice; by it the love of God will be greatly impressed on you." The following prayer, by St. Alphonsus Liguori, may be used to make an act of spiritual communion:

All: My Jesus, I believe that you are present in the Blessed Sacrament. I love you above all things and I desire you with all my heart. Since I cannot now receive you sacramentally, I ask you to come spiritually into my heart. I embrace you as if you were already in my heart and unite myself to you completely. Please do not let me ever be separated from you.

Concluding Rite

Leader: Let us pray: May your family always rejoice together, O God, over the mysteries of redemption they have celebrated and grant its members the perseverance to attain the effects that flow from them. Through Christ our Lord.

All make the Sign of the Cross as the leader prays:

Leader: + May the Lord bless us, protect us from all evil, and bring us to everlasting life.

All: Amen.
