Dear Parishioners,

The Sunday during the Octave of Christmas - the Octave of Christmas being the eight-day period after Christmas - the Church usually celebrates the Feast of the Holy Family. Our second reading on this Feast of the Holy Family comes from the Letter to the Hebrews. In this reading we hear examples of the faith of Abraham (or Abram) from the Book of Genesis:

he left his home after a call from God;

he had a son with his wife Sarah when they were beyond the age of childbearing (as referenced in the first reading), and;

he was willing to sacrifice this son to God.

Abraham did all these things by faith.

As we celebrate the Holy Family, I compare Abraham to Saint Joseph because Joseph likewise acted by faith. Joseph had faith his wife was conceived by the Holy Spirit. By faith Joseph fled his home with his family to live in Egypt for the safety of Jesus.

I think of the faith of St. Joseph because this past December 8, Pope Francis declared a year of St. Joseph until December 8, 2021. Despite a year of St. Joseph, it's easy for me to consider St. Joseph as the hidden man in the Holy Family. He's not mentioned by name in today's relatively long Gospel. Unlike his wife, Mary, Joseph makes no further appearances in the Gospels when Jesus is an adult.

Noting this, in promoting St. Joseph, Pope Francis writes "Saint Joseph reminds us that those who appear hidden or in the shadows can play an incomparable role in the history of salvation" (Pope Francis' Apostolic Letter *Patris Corde - With a Father's Heart*). Pope Francis then applies this hiddenness of St. Joseph to these months of pandemic, stating our lives are:

...sustained by ordinary people, people often overlooked. People who do not appear in newspaper and magazine headlines, or on the latest television show, yet in these very days are surely shaping the decisive events of our history. Doctors, nurses, storekeepers and supermarket workers, cleaning personnel, caregivers, transport workers, men and women working to provide essential services and public safety..." (*Patris Corde*).

With Pope Francis' words about St. Joseph in our minds, when we go about our ordinary tasks, tasks we may think are hidden compared to the big scheme of things, let's have faith that we are sustaining the lives of many. And let's especially work, like St. Joseph, to sustain the lives and the holiness of our families.

On behalf of Deacon John and the St. Jude Church staff, I wish you and your holy families a Merry Christmas!

**Leader:** For all children; may they grow safely in body, mind and spirit, and develop their gifts and talents to their fullest. We pray to the Lord.





## News from Our Sister Parish of Holy Cross

*A recent letter from Fr. Lubermann, Pastor of Holy Cross (with some added notes):*

Dear Fr. Mark, dear members of the committee of St. Jude, dear benefactors, ..., I have always enjoyed hearing from you, and it is also with this same feeling of joy that I am writing to you.

In fact, for the Parish, I am alone as a priest and a seminarian who has to spend only 4 months with us. It is very difficult for me, to be the only one for all the services, to celebrate two Masses every Sunday, one in Holy Cross and another one in a chapel. It is very tiring. (Note: Beside the main church of Holy Cross, Father serves 5 outlying chapels which are some distance away over very rough roads.)

1) Regarding the school, we have launched activities since October 5th, we start tomorrow with the exams of the first period which will last a week. Good news for the students of the 9th grade, we had 99% success, only one failed. We adopted as measures the regular washing of hands at the entrance, insisting on cleanliness and hygiene,...


Thank goodness we hardly hear about Corona in Haiti. (Note: Covid-19 is a problem in Haiti, especially in the more populated areas. Fonds Verrettes is quite remote.)

2) At the Clinic, everything is fine, patients are required to wear masks, but there are some who do not want to and prefer to return home, even with a sick child.

3) God bless you abundantly and bless America, and you will be always in our prayers.

### Spiritual Communion

*Those who are unable to share in the Eucharist may make an act of spiritual communion, expressing their desire for the sacrament.*

*As Pope St. John Paul II reminded us, using the words of St. Teresa of Jesus: "When you do not receive communion and you do not attend Mass, you can make a spiritual communion, which is a most beneficial practice; by it the love of God will be greatly impressed on you." The following prayer, by St. Alphonsus Liguori, may be used to make an act of spiritual communion:*

**All:** My Jesus, I believe that you are present in the Blessed Sacrament. I love you above all things and I desire you with all my heart. Since I cannot now receive you sacramentally, I ask you to come spiritually into my heart. I embrace you as if you were already in my heart and unite myself to you completely. Please do not let me ever be separated from you.

### Concluding Rite

**Leader:** Let us pray: : Keep your family, we pray, O Lord, in your constant care, so that, under your protection, they may be free from all troubles and by good works show dedication to your name. Through Christ our Lord.

*All make the Sign of the Cross as the leader prays:*

**Leader:** + May the Lord bless us, protect us from all evil, and bring us to everlasting life.

**All:** Amen.
