A message from
Fr. Mark Murphy



Dear Parishioners,

Today we celebrate the Epiphany of the Lord. The Greek word *epiphanos* means an appearance or a manifestation. There is evidence the Church celebrated Epiphany before the Church celebrated Christmas. We know of the Epiphany first being celebrated in the late second century whereas we have records of Christmas being celebrated in the fourth century.

On the Epiphany, we commemorate God's self-revelation through Jesus to humanity. Roman Catholic Christians tend to focus on Jesus being revealed to the nations through the Gospel story of the Magi from the East that we hear proclaimed at today's Mass. However, on the Epiphany, Orthodox Christians also commemorate Jesus' baptism (which we as Roman Catholics will celebrate next Sunday). Jesus' baptism is also a divine revelation because at his baptism a voice from heaven identifies Jesus as the Son of God (Mark 1:11).

There are differences in how Christian traditions focus on the Epiphany. Interestingly, there are also variations on how different people respond to the news of a star announcing the newborn king of the Jews in today's Gospel:

- King Herod, who we know from Matthew's Gospel, wants to destroy this potential future king.
- The chief priests and the scribes seem indifferent to the possibility of their new king being born.
- The magi come to do homage to Jesus.

Especially during the Christmas season, we can see ourselves or those we know in one of those variations of people. Maybe there are times when we are opposed to Jesus as our king, especially when living as his disciples means there are parts of our life which still must undergo conversion, parts we'd rather not see destroyed. Or maybe there are times when we seem indifferent to Jesus as our king with the other concerns and demands of life taking precedence. Or maybe there are times when we recognize Jesus as our king. As subjects, or rather as disciples of Jesus our King, we are to imitate the magi and offer gifts to our king.

Our Lord continues to appear to us; to reveal himself to us. May we respond to these epiphanies by offering our hearts and minds as gifts to our king.

What is the best gift you personally would offer to Jesus?

Leader: For immigrants, refugees and all who have come to this country in search of a better life; may we welcome them and recognize the gifts they bring. We pray to the Lord.


Leader: For people at a higher risk of developing COVID-19; may they be protected and comforted. We pray to the Lord.

Lord, help me do things worth more than gold for you.



Eucharistic Adoration is an opportunity for us to be in the Real Presence of Jesus and pray in silence.



Spiritual Communion

Those who are unable to share in the Eucharist may make an act of spiritual communion, expressing their desire for the sacrament.

As Pope St. John Paul II reminded us, using the words of St. Teresa of Jesus: "When you do not receive communion and you do not attend Mass, you can make a spiritual communion, which is a most beneficial practice; by it the love of God will be greatly impressed on you." The following prayer, by St. Alphonsus Liguori, may be used to make an act of spiritual communion:

All: My Jesus, I believe that you are present in the Blessed Sacrament. I love you above all things and I desire you with all my heart. Since I cannot now receive you sacramentally, I ask you to come spiritually into my heart. I embrace you as if you were already in my heart and unite myself to you completely. Please do not let me ever be separated from you.

Concluding Rite

Leader: Let us pray: O God, protector of all who hope in you, bless your people, keep them safe, defend them, prepare them, that, free from sin and safe from the enemy, they may persevere always in your love. Through Christ our Lord.

All make the Sign of the Cross as the leader prays:

Leader: + May the Lord bless us, protect us from all evil, and bring us to everlasting life.

All: Amen.
