

MASS AT ST. JUDE CHURCH

A message from

Fr. Mark Murphy

Last week in this space I shared the first of three parts of Archbishop Jackels' message on the Year of St. Joseph from January 5, 2021. Below is the second part of this message. To read the message in its entirety go to: dbqarch.org/messages-from-archbishop-jackels

Prayers and spiritual practices

Our Holy Father proposes specific prayers and spiritual practices to help us meet the objectives of the year of St. Joseph:

- 1) Meditate for 30 minutes on the Lord's Prayer;
- 2) Participate in a Spiritual Retreat for at least 1 day, with a meditation on Joseph;
- 3) Perform a spiritual or corporal work of mercy;
- 4) Recite the Holy Rosary with a family, or among engaged couples;
- 5) Entrust the day's activities to the protection of St. Joseph;
- 6) Ask for Joseph's intercession on behalf of those looking for employment;
- 7) Recite the Litany to St. Joseph for the Church, persecuted from within and without;
- 8) Recite a prayer to St. Joseph on any Wednesday, or on the 19th of any month, or on the Feast of the Holy Family, or on the 1st of May (Memorial of St. Joseph, the Worker), or on the 19th of March (Solemnity of St. Joseph, Husband of Mary).

Moreover, by way of an incentive, Pope Francis has granted an indulgence for whenever we complete these prayers and spiritual practices, until the end of 8 December 2021.

What is an indulgence?

An indulgence is the pardon by God of all or some of the temporal punishment due to our sins that have already been confessed and forgiven.

The priest in Confession forgives the eternal punishment for sin (read: hell), but also imposes on us a penance, which is a temporal (as opposed to eternal) punishment.

Justice demands we repair the material and spiritual damage our sins caused. We work at this by doing the penance from Confession: a prayer, self-denial, or a work of mercy.

But who knows if that penance is enough to make reparation? So, we are expected to pray, deny ourselves, and serve the poor as the ordinary practice of our Catholic Faith.

We receive the indulgence when we complete a specified prayer or spiritual practice, done with the right disposition, and fulfilling the necessary conditions, namely:

- 1) On that day, be in the state of grace (free from the guilt of mortal sin), and...
- 2) On that day (or 20 days before or after), confess to a priest, and be detached from sin, that is, desire to do better and avoid even the near occasion of sin, and...
- 3) On that day, worthily receive the Eucharist, preferably while participating in Holy Mass, or if that's not possible, outside of Holy Mass, and...
- 4) On that day, pray an Our Father and a Hail Mary for the intentions of the Pope.

People who are homebound, in hospital, or at a care center, because they are frail from age or illness, may also receive an indulgence simply by reciting a prayer to St. Joseph, provided they are detached from sin, and intend to fulfill the above-mentioned conditions as soon as that's possible.


Leader: For an increase in vocations to the priesthood and religious life; may many generous men and women answer the call to service of God's people. We pray to the Lord.


Holy Family Gala Annual Fundraiser





Distraction During Prayer

I get annoyed with myself when I am distracted while I pray. Is it a sin? How can I be more attentive?

The mind is a marvelous and complex thing, producing amazing thoughts, images, wisdom and inspiration. Yet at times it is like a two-year-old: it does not follow directions, does what it wants and loves to tell us "no!" This is probably the oldest and most common problem in the spiritual life—dealing with distraction. It comes in all forms: good intentions forgotten, wandering thoughts at Mass, daydreaming, etc. A little poem says it all: When the soul begins to pray, the brain always wants to play!

There are many ways to handle distractions. If we are distracted by thoughts about our families or friends, we should pray for them. If we lose our focus, we need just "re-collect" ourselves. If some worry or concern just won't leave our mind, then we deal with it and come back to prayer or make it part of our prayer. And when words just won't come, the only prayer we might offer is our presence, our suffering, and our desire to be close to the Lord. Most importantly, we need to be patient with ourselves. These things are not sinful, but reminders of our human frailty. Our weaknesses and good efforts are all acceptable to God, who reads the love in our hearts and the good intentions of our minds.

Inspiration for the Week

“Repent, and believe in the gospel.” Some type of honest and sincere repentance is necessary for any type of authentic growth and maturity. We have to come to the realization, unless we are happy wallowing in immaturity and superficiality, that the way we have been doing things is not the best or the healthiest. There isn’t a human being alive who hasn’t acted foolishly or erratically at the cost of almost losing a treasured relationship. “Why did I act that way?” is a question we often ponder after some reflection and enlightenment. Faith works the same way. Stumbling through life and bumping up against meaninglessness, a person can begin to see that something significant is missing. They see that there is merit to a relationship with God and an embrace of faith. Before these can take root, sincere sorrow for past wrongdoing, missed opportunities, errors in judgment, and short sightedness is necessary. Repentance is necessary. Then having realized that we were walking in darkness, we can rejoice that by God’s grace we now see the light.

Spiritual Communion

Those who are unable to share in the Eucharist may make an act of spiritual communion, expressing their desire for the sacrament.

As Pope St. John Paul II reminded us, using the words of St. Teresa of Jesus: "When you do not receive communion and you do not attend Mass, you can make a spiritual communion, which is a most beneficial practice; by it the love of God will be greatly impressed on you." The following prayer, by St. Alphonsus Liguori, may be used to make an act of spiritual communion:

All: My Jesus, I believe that you are present in the Blessed Sacrament. I love you above all things and I desire you with all my heart. Since I cannot now receive you sacramentally, I ask you to come spiritually into my heart. I embrace you as if you were already in my heart and unite myself to you completely. Please do not let me ever be separated from you.

Concluding Rite

Leader: Let us pray: Lord, grant your people your protection and grace. Give them health of mind and body, perfect love for one another, and make them always faithful to you. Grant this through Christ our Lord.

All make the Sign of the Cross as the leader prays:

Leader: + May the Lord bless us, protect us from all evil, and bring us to everlasting life.

All: Amen.
