A message from*Fr. Mark Murphy*

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend, we begin our journey through the first part of the liturgical season of Ordinary Time that concludes with the beginning of Lent on March 2, 2022 (Ash Wednesday). This weekend is the Second Sunday of Ordinary Time (There is no First Sunday of Ordinary Time, instead last weekend we concluded the Christmas Season with the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord.). The Gospel for the Second Sunday of Ordinary Time, regardless of the current year in the three year cycle of Sunday readings, is always from the Gospel of John. This year we hear a story only found in the Gospel of John and featured in one of our windows at St. Jude, the story of the wedding of Cana.

This Gospel story makes an appearance in what I consider to be a famous novel, *The Brothers Karamazov*, by Russian author, Fyodor Dostoyevsky. In the novel, a man goes to a funeral vigil for a recently deceased priest. As part of the funeral vigil, the Gospel is being read in the presence of the deceased. The man arrives to hear the Gospel we hear at Mass today. The man tries to pray, and he has what I think is one of most descriptive experiences of prayer in literature. While he's praying he comes to realize the Son of God came not to be with humanity in our grief, but He came to be with humanity in our joy. And when there is grief, the Son of God often transforms that grief to joy. This is what Jesus does at the wedding when they almost run out of wine. Jesus transforms this possibility for grief into joy when He transforms the water into wine.

Then as the man's prayer continues, the man imagines himself at the wedding at Cana. And while he's there, he imagines the room or the banquet hall for the wedding to be expanding with more and more people present. Eventually, the man is overjoyed himself when he sees, in his prayer, the deceased priest at the wedding as well. The priest is joyful and laughing.

The New Testament compares the Kingdom of Heaven being a wedding banquet (Matthew 22:1-14, Revelation 19:9). Appropriately the wedding at Cana, which is the first of Jesus' miracles, also foreshadows the joy that belongs to Jesus' disciples who persevere in the Christian life.

May we be counted among those disciples as we begin our journey through Ordinary Time.

HOW TO WORSHIP AT HOLY MASS

A series of short articles about the Mass, written by Archbishop Jackels, will be republished weekly in our bulletin. We invite you to read and to reflect on the following article as one way to grow in the faith.

Week 22: Liturgy of the Word - Profession of Faith

After the homily, everyone stands to recite the Profession of Faith, using either the Apostles' Creed or the Nicene Creed (composed at the Council of Nicea held in 325 AD).

The Creed is a statement about what Christians believe. It is recited to express, affirm, and strengthen personal faith, as well as the bond with the community of believers, the Church.

It is also recited as a sort of preparation for the Eucharistic Prayer, which serves to glorify God and to celebrate the mysteries of God mentioned in the Creed.

When the Creed mentions God becoming man, born of the Virgin Mary, we bow at the waist as a sign of reverence. And on March 25, when we celebrate the actual conception of Jesus in the womb of the Virgin Mary, and on December 25, Christmas day, celebrating Jesus' birth, we genuflect instead of bow, again, as a sign of reverence

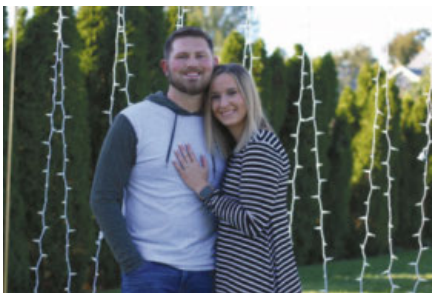
