

A message from

Fr. Mark Murphy

Dear Parishioners,

The Lectionary is the name of the book we use at Mass that has the Bible readings for that particular Mass, whether a particular Mass is on a certain day of the liturgical year (like the 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time or Christmas) or whether a particular Mass is for a specific celebration in the life of the Church (like celebrating the Sacraments of Confirmation or Holy Matrimony). The Lectionary for Sunday Masses, as opposed to weekday Masses, is on a three-year cycle. The three years essentially correspond to three different Gospels we hear on Sundays during the three years: Year A is the Gospel of Matthew; Year B is the Gospel of Mark, and Year C is the Gospel of Luke. We are currently in Year C, so today at Mass we hear from the beginning of the Gospel of Luke.

Regardless of what year it is for the Sunday Lectionary cycle, the second reading at the beginning of Ordinary Time for all three years comes from the first Letter of Saint Paul to the Corinthians. Year C takes its readings from the latter third of 1 Corinthians, which I think has more recognizable readings. For example, next weekend, we'll hear of Saint Paul's famous treatise on love: "Love is patient, love is kind..." (1 Corinthians 13:4). The following weekends draw from 1 Corinthians 15, which includes probably the most descriptive words on the Resurrection of the Body in the New Testament. 1 Corinthians 15 also makes an appearance in George Handel's *Messiah*.

The ancient city of Corinth itself influences what Saint Paul has to say to the Christians there. Corinth is located at an isthmus in Greece. This isthmus connects mainland Greece to the Peloponnesian Peninsula, another part of Greece. Because of its geographic location and being a seaport, Corinth served as a commercial crossroads and a melting pot for different types of people. Sometimes where there are differences among people, there are conflicts, even in the ancient Church.

Paul seeks to address this conflict by comparing the Church to a body, to Christ's body. All the different parts of the body are essential: "The eye cannot say to the hand, 'I do not need you,' nor again the head to the feet, 'I do not need you.'"

All of us, even with, and perhaps because of our differences, are necessary in the Body of Christ. During this week of Prayer for Christian Unity, and as we prepare to participate in a worldwide synod called for by Pope Francis, may we recognize that our differences help to build up and strengthen Christ's Body which is the Church.

HOW TO WORSHIP AT HOLY MASS

A series of short articles about the Mass, written by Archbishop Jackels, will be republished weekly in our bulletin. We invite you to read and to reflect on the following article as one way to grow in the faith.

Week 23: Liturgy of the Word - Prayer of the Faithful

The Liturgy of the Word concludes with the Prayer of the Faithful, which is the congregation's response to what was heard in the Mass readings.

Inspired especially by the teaching, example, and saving deeds of Jesus, in this prayer of petition we connect with others, care about them, and care for them by remembering their needs in prayer, which serves also as a pledge to serve those needs as we are able.

There is no required text, or even a set number of petitions. Traditionally, we pray for the members of the Church, for our country and local community, for peace, for job success and good harvest, for the sick, poor and needy, for those who have died, and for a happy death for ourselves.

The Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) offers free tax preparation to people who need assistance in preparing their own tax returns, including limited English-speaking taxpayers. VITA is a reliable and trusted source for preparing tax returns.

VITA is coming to St. Jude Church on Sunday, February 27, 2022. Registered participants must check in between 12:00 PM and 2:00 PM. Here's how it works:

- Bring tax information with you. If you are married, both spouses must come to this appointment.
- Discuss your information with the tax preparer and leave the information with the tax preparer.
- In 2-3 weeks, return to St. Jude Church to pick up your completed tax return.

If you want someone from VITA to assist you with your tax return:

- 1. <u>Registration is required</u>. Register by contacting Michelle Tressel at 319-390-3520 or m.tressel@dbqarch.org. Space is limited to 16 families.
- 2. After you register, Michelle will send you a list on what to bring to the appointment.

St. Thomas Aquinas | January 28

One of the most famous members of the Dominican Order, St. Thomas Aquinas (1225 – 1274) is well-known by many for his theological work, "The Summa Theologiae." Born in Italy, his mother wanted him to become a Benedictine and had high hopes that he would eventually become abbot of Monte Cassino, where he spent much of his youth. To change his vocation, she had him kidnapped by his brothers on his way to Paris at the age of 19. He spent two years in their captivity. Despite this, nothing could shake him from his vocation to become a Dominican priest and he was eventually released. Once free, he went to Paris and then to Cologne, where he finished his studies with Albert the Great.

His greatest contribution to the Catholic Church is his writings. The unity, harmony, and continuity of faith and reason, of revealed and natural human knowledge, encompasses his writings. The Summa Theologiae, his last and, unfortunately, uncompleted work, deals with the whole of Catholic theology.

The patron saint of teachers, theologians and students, St. Thomas Aquinas died in 1274. His life and the impact he had on the whole Church, however, remains alive today.





Inspiration for the Week

People can easily lose a sense of the sacred and transcendent. When we lose a sense of God's special presence, we need to be brought back. Ezra brought people back to the word of God and they realized what they were missing. Jesus proclaims God's word in the synagogue with true conviction and tells those gathered that he is the fulfillment of all that Isaiah taught. Even though people get lost, distracted, discouraged, and often journey down the wrong path, God's timeless law remains. When we allow ourselves to truly hear God's word and act on it, that living word slowly, over time, changes us. It has the power to soften and mold us, creating within us a joyful spirit. We realize the truth in what God speaks and become open to God's love. Gradually and gently God leads us back where we belong. We discover again the sacred character of life and the wonder of God's power. It is no wonder that Luke addresses his remarks to Theophilus. It is a name that means "beloved of God," a name that can be used by anyone who desires friendship with God.
