A NOTE FROM FATHER LITTLE



Happy New Year!

On behalf of Fr. Michael (and our other rectory roommates), I would like to thank so many of you for the wonderful Christmas gifts and treats that have been delivered over the past few weeks! We are so blessed by the great care and kindness you show to us.

We are always very grateful for the generosity of this parish and school community. Given that sense of gratitude, it is my desire as pastor to be very mindful of the frequency with which we approach you asking for help with our mission. Occasionally, circumstances beyond our control mean that those requests for material help can be bunched together in a way that we would ideally like to avoid. This is one of those occasions where we aren't able to better space out our requests. In the near future, there will be several Sundays in a row where we are going to be presenting to you a request for generosity. There are certain collections we are asked to take up at specific times of the year by the archdiocese, and when your priests want to take some time away on vacation it is a good opportunity to invite the help of missionary priests to help with Mass on those weekends.

Religious sisters, brothers, and priests do not enjoy the same provisions for retirement as "secular" or diocesan clergy, and they rely on the generosity of the faithful through the **Retirement Fund for Religious**. We at St. John the Baptist are uniquely blessed in that we have the company and service of an active religious community: our beloved Sisters of Pro Ecclesia Sancta. Many Catholics in parish life do not have the blessing of being in and around their parish or school and seeing an active community of religious. This is all the more reason for us to be generous as a parish, as we see before us the joy and depth brought by the presence of those generous souls who offer their whole lives to Jesus through their vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience. Envelopes will be available at the tables as you enter church or please write "Retirement Fund for Religious" if you use your own envelope. You can drop your donation in the collection basket or mail to the parish office.

Another opportunity to share our material gifts is the annual **Catholic Services Appeal Foundation (CSAF)** the weekend of February 13/14. I am so grateful to be with a parish community that has excelled in generosity in this effort. I salute all of our parishioners for a long legacy of supporting the many areas of ministry that our local church relies on its parishes to support. Most specifically, it is always a comfort to know that if a parishioner ends up at a hospital that is distant from Savage, their sacramental needs will be met by a priest-chaplain where they are. This is just one place that the help of people from many parishes provides for a need that is greater than any one parish can bear. Although the CSAF supports many worthy ministries—and you will certainly be hearing about them—we have experienced the need for reliable hospital ministry in a way we could never have anticipated. We need only look to the fruitfulness of the so-called "COVID Corps" to see an expression of what is possible through our generosity. And let's always remember that our "All In" doesn't stop at the boundaries of Savage and that we are a part of a local and Universal Church.

Lastly, I am pleased to welcome Fr. Steve LaCanne of **Cross Catholic Outreach** on the weekend of January 23/24. Fr. LaCanne is a retired priest of the archdiocese and a friend to us in the rectory

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTIONS

Feast of the Baptism of the Lord Weekend of January 9/10, 2021

On this first weekend after the Feast of the Epiphany, the Gospel reading reminds us of Jesus' baptism. It gives meaning to our own baptism into Christ Jesus. Jesus' baptism is a reminder that he is not only our Lord

but also our brother. He was baptized, just as we are. He shares in our humanity. Good stewards recognize that their baptisms call them to conform their daily lives to Jesus' teachings, and to live their lives as Jesus did. Through their baptism, they have been given the necessary gifts to share with others the new creation that Christ brings. The stewardship question is whether we can recognize our own baptismal gifts, and like Jesus, use those gifts to bring the hope of Christ to the lives of others.

Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

Weekend of January 16/17, 2021

Christian stewardship begins with the call to discipleship and in today's Gospel we discover those first individuals who sought out Jesus and wanted to listen to him, learn from him and stay with him. Today, Christian stewards search out the hidden presence of Jesus in their own lives every day. They know Christ is the "Messiah" who will one day bring about a perfect restoration to a troubled world. They further understand that they are sacraments of his hidden presence in the world. Their task is to make that reality known through their own words and actions. What is one thing we can do to be better stewards of Christ's life in us?






