A few thoughts on altar servers...

As mentioned a few weeks ago in the announcements at the end of Mass, the cramp put on a lot of our liturgical ministries due to the pandemic is beginning to go away. We are grateful for those many volunteers who have remained willing to serve throughout, and are also looking forward to welcoming new volunteers into any number of the responsibilities that are needed to make our weekend liturgies flow as we hope they will. It is so important for us to be continuing to give glory to God and meeting the needs of our parish and school family as fruitfully as we can. One of the many responsibilities that was inhibited due to the pandemic was altar serving. Thanks to the attentiveness and sacrifice of Deacon Joel Neisen in particular, we are seeing the return of that important ministry, which is one that is to be taken up mainly by the younger demographic in our parish.

Even as we've gotten excited about welcoming back altar servers, we know that there has been some uncertainty around the return altar serving. I'm particularly aware as pastor the questions have arisen among some about the new beginning of altar serving at this time.

I'd like to answer a few questions regarding the Ministry of altar serving-its meaning and purpose, and our hopes for it in the future at St. John's.

Why are altar servers important?

Altar serving has been a long and important tradition in the history of the church. Because the liturgy is the source and summit of all we do, it is a solemn responsibility and the highest expression of who we are as Catholics. But because the liturgy takes place in time and space, there is practical help that needs to be added to it. During the pandemic, you saw our clergy largely celebrating the liturgy without the assistance of altar servers. However this is not the ideal. The church has long treasured the tradition of inviting younger people to perform some of the adjacent tasks to the celebration of the Mass at the altar: carrying vessels, carrying the missal, lighting candles, and any other duties that arise. Our faith is a faith in the Incarnation of Jesus, who comes into our time and space as a human being. Even though the liturgy is otherworldly, it also takes place in this world with its practical needs.

So I get it, there's a practical need for altar servers. But what about a spiritual need?

As with many things in the church, what begins as a practical need can be given a spiritual meaning as well. Even though servers serve a practical need, over the centuries serving at the altar has become a way to draw young people close to what is holy, in the

hopes that they might at least consider a vocation to the priesthood or religious life. Obviously for much of the tradition, only young men were invited to serve at the altar because young men would be the only ones discerning a vocation to the priesthood. In recent years, however, Pope Saint John Paul II extended permission for girls to serve at the altar as well. Even though their altar serving might not be aimed at the priesthood per se, we hope to awaken in them a desire to serve the church in some form of women's consecrated life. At St. John's, we have the added blessing of the presence of our Sisters of Pro Ecclesia Sancta, who model so beautifully for our young women the possibility of a life consecrated to God.

I heard altar serving is becoming a bigger deal with more commitment at SJB. Is this true?

Yes. As we reintroduce altar serving after the natural pause of the pandemic, and especially given the reasons above, we want to develop a group of servers, parents, and leaders who have made a true and meaningful commitment to the Lord and the Church in this important ministry. This is why there has been more extensive training and a more comprehensive manual for altar servers in their responsibilities. This is a ministry (or extracurricular, if you will) that asks more of participants, because unlike any other activity a young person could be involved in, it is dedicated entirely to God. Parents and servers should be aware of this.

At the same time, we also want to stress that we are not asking for super-athlete perfection in our servers, even as we give clear expectations. We know it will take time to learn and grow. Fr. Matthew and I will always be patient and gentle with servers. We will never get angry or impatient with servers as they learn. We believe this will allow servers to develop into leaders within the program themselves, who can then be entrusted with a leadership role in training new servers as they enter the program.

These are just a few initial thoughts on altar serving, and I hope they bring clarity. Please reach out with any other questions you might have and that I could answer in a future article!

We are also grateful to the adults who have stepped forward to help coordinate and train and be an example for our altar servers. This is a place I firmly believe that lay faithful should be active, and it is great to see this happening!

New Auxiliary Bishop

I am thrilled, and grateful to God, for Pope Francis' appointment of Bishop-elect Joseph Williams as our new auxiliary bishop in the Archdiocese of St. Paul and Minneapolis. Bishop-elect Williams is one of the most gentle and holy priests I know, and his ministry in the Latino community for many years has had my deep admiration. He will be ordained bishop at the Cathedral on January 25th, the Feast of the Conversion of St. Paul, one of the patronal feasts of our Archdiocese.
