This past week I was doing Evening" Prayer from Liturgy of the Hours and a reading from James 5:7-9 really hit me. "Be patient, my brothers and sisters, until the coming of the Lord. See how

the farmer awaits the precious yield of the soil. He looks forward to it patiently while the soil receives the winter and spring rains. You too, must be patient. Steady your hearts, because the coming of the Lord is at hand."

We may ask ourselves, what are we waiting for? Father Eilen has been working on the pursuit of happiness for the last three weeks. The 1st week he talked about instant gratification-immediate, like Deacon George thinking of donuts and stopping at the Holiday gas station and getting his donuts every morning. The 2nd week he talked about personal achievement/ego-based on comparing ourselves to others—taking advantage of them, or not thinking we are good enough. It's all about personal power, control, jealousy, fear of failure, and contempt of others. Most of us fall somewhere in between. Gratification here is usually short-term, as I mentioned-momentary self-satisfaction. This past week, he focused on looking beyond ourselves. As the first two weeks were focused on self-satisfaction, during the 3rd week we start to look beyond ourselves. Decisions here are focused on doing the greater good for others. Some of this may be helping out a neighbor and not expecting anything in return. It's not about me but helping others-long-term gratification. This week I believe, Father will be talking about the ultimate good —by participating in giving and receiving the ultimate meaning, goodness, ideals, and love. Good is the ultimate by looking at truth, love, justice, beauty, and peace. All of these characteristics lead us to and can be found in Jesus Christ our Savior. That is Who we are waiting for. As mentioned in the reading above, we must be patient and steady our hearts, because the coming of the Lord is at hand.

Our true happiness is knowing the love of Jesus in our heart, mind, and soul. A time we can spend with Jesus. This is the eternal gratification that we are looking for. Merry Christmas to all of you; let us strive to know the love of Christ in our hearts each and every day.
