First Reading (*Jos 24:1-2a, 15-17, 18b*)

Joshua gathered together all the tribes of Israel at Shechem, summoning their elders, their leaders, their judges, and their officers. When they stood in ranks before God, Joshua addressed all the people: "If it does not please you to serve the LORD, decide today whom you will serve, the gods your fathers served beyond the River or the gods of the Amorites in whose country you are now dwelling. As for me and my household, we will serve the LORD." But the people answered, "Far be it from us to forsake the LORD for the service of other gods. For it was the LORD, our God, who brought us and our fathers up out of the land of Egypt, out of a state of slavery. He performed those great miracles before our very eyes and protected us along our entire journey and among the peoples through whom we passed. Therefore we also will serve the LORD, for he is our God."

Second Reading (*Eph 5:21-32 or 5:2a, 25-32*)

Brothers and sisters:
Be subordinate to one another out of reverence for Christ. Wives should be subordinate to their husbands as to the Lord. For the husband is head of his wife just as Christ is head of the church, he himself the savior of the body. As the church is subordinate to Christ, so wives should be subordinate to their husbands in everything. Husbands, love your wives, even as Christ loved the church and handed himself over for her to sanctify her, cleansing her by the bath of water with the word, that he might present to himself the church in splendor, without spot or wrinkle or any such thing, that she might be holy and without blemish. So also husbands should love their wives as their own bodies. He who loves his wife loves himself. For no one hates his own flesh but rather nourishes and cherishes it, even as Christ does the church, because we are members of his body.
For this reason a man shall leave his father and his mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh.
This is a great mystery, but I speak in reference to Christ and the church.

Gospel (*Jn 6:60-69*)


Many of Jesus' disciples who were listening said, "This saying is hard; who can accept it?" Since Jesus knew that his disciples were murmuring about this, he said to them, "Does this shock you? What if you were to see the Son of Man ascending to where he was before? It is the spirit that gives life, while the flesh is of no avail. The words I have spoken to you are Spirit and life. But there are some of you who do not believe." Jesus knew from the beginning the ones who would not believe and the one who would betray him. And he said, "For this reason I have told you that no one can come to me unless it is granted him by my Father." As a result of this, many of his disciples returned to their former way of life and no longer accompanied him. Jesus then said to the Twelve, "Do you also want to leave?" Simon Peter answered him, "Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and are convinced that you are the Holy One of God."

From the Desk of Fr. Josh

“Who are you?” he said, barely above a whisper.

“One who has waited for you to speak.”

This quotation is from “The Horse and His Boy,” the third book of *The Chronicles of Narnia*. It is a story about a horse named Bree and his boy named Shasta. They go on a wild adventure from Calormen (a country south of Narnia) to Narnia and they encounter many roadblocks along the way. At the cusp of their journey when they have run out of energy and find themselves lost in a fog, they realize there is another person with them. The person comes up beside them and Shasta starts the dialogue above to which the figure replies. The figure goes on to explain to Shasta that he has been helping the pair along their journey. This figure could be compared to God.



This dialogue is important then because it can relate to our spiritual life. Oftentimes in life we experience many difficult things and the Lord is waiting for us to speak to Him. In the Gospel this weekend, Simon Peter says to Jesus, “Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and are convinced that you are the Holy One of God.”

In our journey of faith, we are oftentimes not fully convinced that Jesus is with us, waiting for us to speak to Him or that He is with us in the chaos of our lives. We are often tempted to look to other things for comfort. This week, spend some time in prayer; what are those comforts you run to? Is God inviting you to spend more time with Him? Peter said, “He has the words of eternal life.” Are we convinced that Jesus is with us? Brothers and sisters, run to Jesus. He is waiting for you to speak to Him.



Giving Appreciated Stock Now

You've likely seen recent reports of record highs in the stock market. The market doesn't perform according to calendar dates, like year-end giving timelines. For appreciated assets, the best time to give is when you feel they've appreciated and can maximize your charitable giving.

Giving long-term appreciated stock — stock that you've held for more than one year — to St. John Neumann is a smart way to give for three reasons:

- 1) When the market is strong and your stock has appreciated, the value of your gift is higher. Simply put, you have more to give.
- 2) You may be able to give up to 30% more by avoiding capital gains tax on stock when you gift it to St. John Neumann Catholic Church. This is especially beneficial when the stock has experienced significant growth.
- 3) You may also receive an income tax deduction for the full value of the donation up to 30% of your adjusted gross income.
