First Reading (Dt 6:2-6)

Moses spoke to the people, saying:
"Fear the LORD, your God,
and keep, throughout the days of your lives,
all his statutes and commandments which I enjoin on you,
and thus have long life.
Hear then, Israel, and be careful to observe them,
that you may grow and prosper the more,
in keeping with the promise of the LORD, the God of your fathers,
to give you a land flowing with milk and honey.
"Hear, O Israel! The LORD is our God, the LORD alone!
Therefore, you shall love the LORD, your God,
with all your heart,
and with all your soul,
and with all your strength.
Take to heart these words which I enjoin on you today."

Second Reading (Heb 7:23-28)

Brothers and sisters:
The levitical priests were many
because they were prevented by death from remaining in office,
but Jesus, because he remains forever,
has a priesthood that does not pass away.
Therefore, he is always able to save those who approach God
through him,
since he lives forever to make intercession for them.
It was fitting that we should have such a high priest:
holy, innocent, undefiled, separated from sinners,
higher than the heavens.
He has no need, as did the high priests,
to offer sacrifice day after day,
first for his own sins and then for those of the people;
he did that once for all when he offered himself.
For the law appoints men subject to weakness to be high priests,
but the word of the oath, which was taken after the law,
appoints a son,
who has been made perfect forever.

Gospel (Mk 12:28b-34)

One of the scribes came to Jesus
and asked him,
"Which is the first
of all the commandments?"
Jesus replied, "The first is this:
Hear, O Israel!
The Lord our God is Lord alone!
You shall love the Lord your God
with all your heart,
with all your soul,
with all your mind,
and with all your strength.
The second is this:
You shall love your neighbor as yourself.
There is no other commandment
greater than these."
The scribe said to him,
"Well said, teacher.
You are right in saying,
'He is One
and there is no other than he.'
And 'to love him with all your heart,
with all your understanding,
with all your strength,
and to love your neighbor as yourself'
is worth more than all burnt offerings
and sacrifices."
And when Jesus saw that he answered
with understanding, he said to him,
"You are not far
from the kingdom of God."
And no one dared to ask him any
more questions.

“Adventures are never fun while you're having them.” This quotation from *The Voyage of the Dawn Treader* (*The Chronicles of Narnia*) seems weird at first. When we think of adventures often we think of telling the stories of adventures which of course are fun. If you take a second look at adventures does this quotation hold true?

For me, I think of one of my adventures up north with some friends in the early spring a few years ago. We left behind the dirty stubborn spots of snow caked on the pavements in Saint Paul to go past Duluth to a cabin. One of the days we decided to go for a hike at a state park just a few miles away and take a shortcut on a snow-laden dirt road rather than on the paved route. Long story short, we didn't make it to the state park because our vehicles got stuck in the snow drifts.

Thankfully, the crew I was with were young men who were ready for a muddy hike. We were well experienced in the realities of living in Minnesota. As I look back at four hours of digging out those cars and going little by little back to the paved roads, the thing that sticks out to me now are all the good times. Specifically, getting enough momentum on a downhill to cruise, rally car-style, to the paved road. As it wasn't that long ago, I still remember miserably pushing each car out one small hill, one small snowdrift, at a time getting a little bit more soaked and muddy each time.

Using the quotation from this book, I invite you to take a look at the adventures of your life. Were they actually as fun as you remember them? With this in mind, moving forward in the adventures of your daily life, amidst all the troubles we have, we are reminded today that adventures are never fun while you are having them. As we look back though, we remember the good times and the friendships and that come from difficult times.


