Christ's Temptations, and Ours

Dear Friends,

The purpose of Lent is to grow closer to Christ. That's it. It happens through all types of 'tried and true' spiritual practices, but they all have one purpose: seeing and knowing the Son of Man more completely. Let's ask the Holy Spirit to keep that one goal before us. Making simple observations and asking basic questions about our readings this weekend is a great

place to start.

A wise pastor of souls, Fr. Roger Landry, helped me do that this past week. He wrote, "The episode in today's Gospel is particularly special, because the only way the evangelists would have known about it would have been if Christ had told it to his disciples himself. No one else was there. The Lord must have opened up his heart to them about this seminal moment in his autobiography, which occurred immediately (Mk 1:12) after he was baptized in the Jordan by John the Baptist."

I've meditated on the temptations of Jesus many, many times – it's so central to Lent – and yet this simple observation really struck me: Jesus must have relayed to this encounter to His friends. They had to think, "Even Jesus has temptations placed on his path!" After witnessing His baptism, the Holy Spirit descending on Him, the Father speaking to Him, they might have thought Jesus wouldn't be subject to such things. They learned otherwise.

In one of the most beautiful lines in Sacred Scripture, the letter to the Hebrews tells us, "We do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who in every respect has been tested as we are, yet never sinned" (Heb 4:15). Please keep that truth close to you as you journey this Lent, for Christ is always near, ready to cast out the lies satan places at your feet.

Jesus, we trust in you. Reveal yourself to us more fully. Teach us not to negotiate with the temptations that comes our way, but instead declare the truth of being chose by you and for you.

May this Lent help you draw closer to Christ.
