A Note from Our Pastor

Thanks to all who joined us for the online Advent wreath service. We will gather each Sunday at 4 pm on the Pax YouTube channel as a virtual community. This week we will include a blessing of a Christmas tree. There is still time to get out your Advent wreath (or create one of your own) and be part of this beautiful devotion for the coming weeks of Advent.

Wednesday is the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception. It is a Holy Day of Obligation. Please join us for one of the Masses that day: 9 am, 12:10 pm and 7 pm.

We will not be having a Communal Reconciliation this year. A few of the parishes will and we will share that info. Please watch for additional confession times in next week's bulletin. We invite you to join us at one of those times.

A couple of years ago I grabbed an Advent reflection book on the way to a meeting hoping for an appropriate prayer for the meeting. This is what I found: "Dear God, we are bombarded daily by evil news from around the world. Help us to seek you in prayer and to drink from the sources of faith so that we can accept unshaken whatever the world sends our way." Our readings today bring us a message of Advent assurance. God is at work in us and will bring God's work to completion within us. Those words are part of the Ordination Rite but also remind all of us that God's purpose goes ever forward and that God is coming to set things right in the world.

The prophet Baruch and the Psalmist offer words of hope as we long for God to do what only God can do – set things right and come in fullness to save our conflicted world. There is lots of bad news. We don't have to listen to the news or read the papers for very long to find evidence of challenge in our world. This was true for Baruch as well. The scribe Ezra also describes this event but it is not so glorious. A broken and dispirited people trudged into Jerusalem without much sense of hope. Baruch uses his exalted language to help raise the peoples' spirits.

The Gospel also roots God's working in human history. The list of the rulers of the age show us that God's Word is not otherworldly. Luke is very specific and concrete in placing where and when the Word of God came to John. He spells out the date and the political and religious realities of the time. It is a reminder that no matter what we face in life, the Word of God is present and active in the here and now.







Pope Francis new book - Let Us Dream

Along the way, he offers dozens of wise and surprising observations on the value of unconventional thinking, on why we must dramatically increase women's leadership in the Church and throughout society, on what he learned while scouring the streets of Buenos Aires with garbage-pickers, and much more.
