A **tremendous "thank you"** to all who worked so hard on our beautiful Christmas liturgies. Many hours are spent in planning and preparation (think of the hours spent just by our musicians!). How blessed we are with such dedicated parishioners and staff who, each year, go out of their way to assist us in our praise and worship — not just on this one week but every week throughout the year. May the Lord bless them in a special way as we enter a new calendar year.

Family is an important aspect of our parish life. The Sunday after Christmas is the Feast of the Holy Family. We celebrate that Jesus came, not fully formed and powerful but, in the midst of a human family. The vulnerability of the baby Jesus is a mirror of our own vulnerability as we make our way through life. I am struck by the ways that dreams take center stage in the nativity narratives of Matthew and Luke's Gospels. A few years ago, Pope Francis spoke to a meeting with families and talked about the importance of dreams in our families:

"I am very fond of dreams in families. For nine months, every mother and father dream about their baby. Am I right? [Yes!] They dream about what kind of child he or she will be... You can't have a family without dreams. Once a family loses the ability to dream, children do not grow, love does not grow, life shrivels up and dies. So I ask you each evening, when you make your examination of conscience, to also ask yourselves this question: Today did I dream about my children's future? Today did I dream about the love of my husband, my wife? Did I dream about my parents and grandparents who have gone before me?" — Address, Meeting with Families, January 16, 2015

January 1 is the Solemnity of Mary, under her title of Mother of God, and a holy day of obligation. Please check this bulletin for Mass times. The title "Mother of God" is one of the most ancient of all Mary's titles.



We thank all those who returned to in-person activities. This last year has been a challenge!










EXPLORING THE MYSTERIES OF LIFE

Encounters with Mary -Saints Who Held Baby Jesus

Many of us have seen the holy cards or statues of saints such as Saint Anthony tenderly cradling the Infant Jesus in their arms—but are we familiar with the beautiful true stories behind these depictions? For



example, Anthony often spent time praying in a hermitage supported by a Count about 11 miles from Padua. One night, Anthony's little cell suddenly filled up with light when Jesus appeared to him in the form of a tiny child. Passing by the hermitage, the Count saw the light shining from the room and Anthony holding the infant. The Count fell to his knees upon seeing this wondrous sight. When the vision ended, Anthony saw the Count kneeling at the door. He begged Count Tiso not to reveal what he had seen until after his death. Come and explore with us this and other heartwarming stories of saints who held Baby Jesus.
