A New Way to Look at Stewardship

Try to remember January of 2020. It seems like a lifetime ago. So much has happened in all of our lives since then. Let me take you back in time. St. Patrick's was holding all parish meetings designed to let the entire parish know about the new parish leadership structure. Six commissions would fall under the Parish Pastoral Council (PPC). One of these commissions would be new, the Administrations Commission (AC).

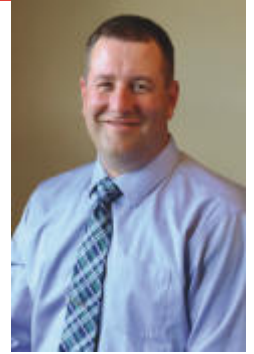
Three subcommittees fall under the AC: buildings and grounds, communications and stewardship. The overall goal of each committee and the AC as a whole, is to in a way shine a light on these areas and bring more visibility of the good work being done to the parish. This centralized parishioner driven form of leadership would bring about new ideas and a greater sense of participation. One of these areas, stewardship, has been a primary topic of discussion at recent meetings. The members of the AC felt that the parish needed a common definition of what stewardship means to St. Patrick's Church. The well-seasoned understanding of the stewardship aspects of time, talent and treasure are still valid; a new more comprehensive meaning would be sought.

According to Dave Baranoski, the Stewardship Education Director of the Archdiocese of St. Louis, stewardship is a "Dependence on God, recognizing that everything we have is a gift from God. Everything we have and everything we do is a result of some gift God has placed in our hands." Dependence on God is the basis for the Stewardship Committee to begin to develop a common definition of what exactly stewardship means to St. Patrick's.

Some key words have surfaced in the last few meetings among members of the AC. These key words are: Prayer, Participation, Generosity and Active Discipleship. Each word in its own way recognizes a dependence on God as described above by Dave Baranoski. To begin to understand stewardship, we first must accept that we are dependent on God and using our gifts to build his kingdom in every moment of our lives. As parishioners of this Church, we assist and support one another in realizing our role in stewardship.

The Stewardship Committee in its current form is new. We are just getting started in working to bring great things to you, our parishioners. We all have much to learn. Coming together as parishioners, taking the time to listen and grow together advances our mission and strengthens our parish. Looking at the first key word listed above, prayer, we understand that we are constantly evolving in our own prayer lives. Each encounter with God allows us a greater understanding of prayer. Our appreciation of prayer allows us to understand exactly how much we are dependent of God and to be grateful for his many gifts.

If you are interested in learning more, or helping with Stewardship in our parish, please consider attending one of the AC meetings. We have much to learn from each other and would be grateful for your perspective. Our meetings are listed on the last page of the bulletin. If you would like to attend, have valuable feedback or questions, please contact the parish office.

Vacation Bible School Is Coming To St. Patrick's: Vacation Bible School is being planned for onsite learning the week of July 26th to July 30th. "Treasured-Where children discover they are priceless to God" is the Vacation Bible School we will be having onsite this July. Children will attend from 9am to 12noon each day. We will have singing, crafts, bible stories, skits, hands on learning and games. The price is \$30.00 per child which includes a t-shirt and a music CD. Attention Parishioners Interested In Adult Education: St. Patrick's wants to move ahead with adults continuing to learn about our shared faith even in the pandemic. Many parishioners have shown interest in learning but are unable to attend the times (before the pandemic) when we had Whole Community Catechesis during the session times for Faith Formation on Sunday morning and Wednesday evenings. Now, St. Patrick's is looking at a new model called small group interaction. If you are interested in forming a small group and becoming the leader, parishioners can meet in their homes or onsite once approved. We have several bible study units on DVD that could be shared and leader guides are available including Jeff Cavins Walk through the Narrative Books of the Bible, the Book of Acts, Revelations and the Catholicism series, A Biblical Walk through the Mass. We also have video series pertaining to the Saints, Pivotal players in our faith, Priest, Prophet and King series all by Bishop Robert Barron. If you are interested in being trained as a small group leader and sharing a DVD series with a small group, please contact Teresa Neuman.

Great things are happening in Faith Formation: SAVE THE DATE-Wednesday evening, April 28th at 6:30 pm in the church. I will be giving a PowerPoint presentation concerning all aspects of the Faith Formation program. Topics covered will include when to sign your children up for the sacraments, First Reconciliation, First Eucharist and Confirmation. I will explain the concept of Whole Community Catechesis and how your child has the ability to learn about their faith in grades pre-school (must be 4 years old by Sept. 1, 2021) through High School. We will talk about youth activities and an exciting new gathering time between the faith formation sessions on Wednesday evening. You will be able to ask questions, register your children and find out about everything we are planning for a new Faith Formation year beginning in September 2021. Spread the news. Everyone is welcome. This meeting will not last longer than 45 minutes it will be well worth your time. Grandparents are welcome to attend as well.
