Barb Hoots and Sue Johnson, Synod Ambassador Team

Do you remember what the SYNOD is? Do you recall why the Archbishop called for an Archdiocesan Synod? How is St. Patrick's Church involved in this? How does it affect me?

These are all good questions and we would like to bring you up to speed on what we have been doing since COVID changed all of our lives!

The Synod was called to help Archbishop Hebda discern and address the most pressing needs of the local church. He appointed an Executive Team and then each parish created a Synod Ambassador team. St. Patrick parish created our team and held its first meeting in November 2019. That fall and winter, the Archdiocese held 19 Prayer and Listening Sessions, 11 Focus Events, and the Disciple Maker Index Survey. Over 8,000 people participated and over 35,000 comments were given. A number of our parishioners attended the Prayer and Listening sessions along with our Parish Synod Ambassador team. There were 160 parishioners who took the Disciple Maker Index Survey.

The Archbishop and his Executive team looked over ALL of the information they received from the Listening Sessions and from the surveys and came up with 3 focus areas:

- Forming parishes that are in the service of evangelization
- Forming missionary disciples who know Jesus' love and respond to his call
- Forming youth and young adults in and for a Church that is always young

St. Patrick's Synod Ambassador Team is recommending the following focuses for our church after reviewing guidelines from the Archdiocese and feedback from parishioners:

1. Create an environment that encourages young people to attend church and participate in the Catholic community.
2. Create an environment where members are interested, welcoming and caring about others so that relationships can be built and developed.
3. Create diverse opportunities across age levels to grow spiritually, connecting growth in one's faith journey with one's life experiences.

The parish team is meeting regularly and planning on the next Synod event: Small group sessions that will be held this fall in our parish and all other parishes in the Archdiocese. Your participation in these 6 sessions will help finalize the direction for our parish and the Archdiocese.

After the parish Small Groups sessions, there will be a Deanery Consultation process in January/February. The Synod will be held on Pentecost weekend of 2022 at the cathedral. Archbishop Hebda, will then prepare a pastoral plan for the Archdiocese, which he expects to release on November 20, 2022, the feast of Christ the King.

Please pray and consider attending the Small Group sessions that will be occurring in the fall. We all have ideas about how our church is functioning, and it would be beneficial to share our ideas with each other.

Confirmation Candidates and their Saint Reports: This year all our confirmation candidates were asked to write a saint report. We asked that each Confirmation candidate write about what attracted them to the saint they had chosen. We asked them to reflect on why their chosen saint chose to step forward and in some instances risk their lives to make the name of Jesus Christ known and loved. These candidates did not disappoint. They were introspective about how examining the life of the saint they had chosen brought them to reflect on their own faith journey. Please watch for future excerpts from their saint reports in the bulletin and a display of the reports in the gathering space beginning on May 17. Confirmation will take place at the parish on Sunday, June 6th at 2 pm.

The social justice commission is looking for volunteers and donations for the community garden—soon to be renamed Marian garden: As we wait for the garden to once again take shape next to the lower parking lot, we must focus on what the garden has always been—an outreach project to support Neighbors Inc. food shelf. We need people to donate their extra seedlings, plants and seeds for the garden. We have asked Neighbors Inc. what kind of produce they would need for this year and zucchini, squash and cherry tomatoes did not make the cut. They already receive plenty of those. We need pepper plants of all kinds, regular tomatoes plants, beans, cucumbers, eggplant, leafy greens, broccoli and cauliflower. You can bring your donation to the parish the first week of May. We also need volunteers to tend the garden. If you would like to help plant, weed, harvest or deliver produce from the garden to Neighbors Inc. please contact Teresa Neuman at neuman@churchofstpatrik.com. Gardening is a great activity for families. We welcome family involvement. You can volunteer for a week in the summer, a day to plant or once a week for any month, June, July and August.

The Marian Garden is underway at St. Patrick's: Our facilities staff has been hard at work shifting soil and starting the reframing of the community garden growing boxes that will be renamed in honor of our Blessed Mother. A statue of the Virgin Mary is on her way from Italy. Please take some time and look at the drawings for the garden on display in the gathering space. If you would like to contribute to making the garden space a reality, please make your check out to St. Patrick's with "Marian Garden" in the memo space. We are accepting donations in honor of family members as well. Please pray for the success of this project.

Vacation Bible School is being planned for onsite learning the week of July 26th to July 30th: "Treasured—Where children discover they are priceless to God" is the Vacation Bible School we will be having onsite this July. Children will attend from 9am to 12noon each day. We will have singing, crafts, bible stories, skits, hands on learning and games. The price is \$30.00 per child which includes a t-shirt and a music CD. May 2, 2021 5th Sunday of Easter

“Spiraling out of control,” is a phrase that can easily describe the current display of human existence. In addition to the violence, unrest, uneasiness and turmoil that are common elements of our daily news, other essential pieces are misplaced or missing. Many lack an objective center around which to order and structure their lives or a clear set of definable goals or mores to act as guideposts and life directives. It appears that “feelings” have become a “new god” and traditional structures and ideals set aside. It is almost as if history only shows that we got this whole thing wrong and many are determined to finally set things right. The real truth, however, is that while wrongs and errors are certainly a part of our often-checked past, it is hardly the case that all was wrong. It is not our task to rewrite the history of our lives, but to learn from mistakes that were made, and preserve the perennial wisdom at the root of our successes. Learning is an essential part of being human.

The question becomes, however, from whom do we learn? Some have such a hard time placing God in that position, but that is precisely where God needs to be. God is the Master Teacher from whom all of humanity learns and gets its cues. It is in and through this relationship with the Gardener of Life that we are fashioned and pruned into the people we are intended to be and can be. It is only in God that we are able to find our best selves. Sadly, many think that religion too, as well as history in general, has also gotten all this wrong. Yet, our resurrection faith tells us differently. We are reminded, today especially, that we are meant to remain in Christ as Christ remains in us. We are also reminded that Jesus, the Incarnate God, is the vine upon which we grow, the branches that flow from the source of God’s life.

Giving up our will to God’s can be a painful endeavor. It is not easy to set our own desires and wants aside and allow God to step in and direct and guide our growth. But this is the only way to prevent deadly weeds from overtaking us and bringing us to a place of self-destruction. God’s commandments are the very guideposts and benchmarks we need, yet many seek to remove them from all public view because they appear to limit self-expression and suppress what is considered by many to be “human freedom.” They are the only way we can find freedom, however. And, until we learn this fundamental lesson, we will continue to spiral out of control, never really knowing who we are, what our potential can be or how life really can be lived. Branching Out Isn’t Always What It’s Cracked Up to Be

“That’s a really beautiful tree branch. Man, would you look at the bark on that thing? The others are real duds, but that low-hanging branch has really got it all together.”

I’ve never heard anyone say this. Maybe I just need to hang out with more arborists, but I can’t recall ever hearing someone admire the particular beauty of a single branch. When someone comments on a tree, it’s usually the whole tree — perhaps a visual element of it, like the color of the leaves or its height. But people don’t usually zero in on one branch.

Maybe that’s because usually, if one branch is looking a little weak, chances are every other branch is, too.

The Bible tells us that when we bear fruit as good everyday stewards, it is for the Father’s glory. We are the branch on His magnificent tree. What we have is from Him, and what we do likewise points back to Him. We also tend to reflect how well the other branches around us are incorporating the nutrients coming their way. That’s all fine and good in theory. In practice, it can be an arduous exercise in humility.

When I do something virtuous or charitable or kind, there is a part of me that wants to stand out for it. I think that’s true for all of us. We’ve given of ourselves in some way or overcome some human temptation to accomplish a little bit of good in this world, and even though we know God sees us, we’d really love for everyone else to see it, too.

It’s a struggle, for sure. But we need to remember that our fruit belongs to the whole tree.
