Kim Thompson, Director of Liturgy and Music

I enjoy listening to the radio when I drive, and I have my favorite short list of stations that play predominantly “Top-40” songs – new pieces by popular artists. New music is great and all, but sometimes I want to belt out a song I know all the words to. That’s when I pull up Pandora and play the ‘90s Alternative station. I don’t know all the songs that cycle through, but I know enough of them to get in a good jam session of singing that feels really satisfying.



If someone wanted to know if you knew a song, would they ask you, “Is ‘Over the Rainbow’ a song you have memorized?” No, you would answer, “that’s a song I know by heart.” When we know something “by heart,” we are so familiar with it that performing that action doesn’t require conscious effort. We can express our emotions and a deep sense of interpretation when we know something by heart. It can be a spiritual experience, a deeply faith-filled experience, to sing at church the songs we know by heart. But worship is not and cannot be a playlist of one’s favorite songs played out week after week. Our Catholic worship consists of liturgy that is sung. There are a number of values at play that make our worship not a static list of favorites, but a dynamic corpus of music that meets the needs of many different kinds of people.

The special actions, gestures and words that make up our Eucharistic liturgies require special music to accompany the rituals, give life to the words and bring us closer to God. All the music contained in the Mass is for ritual, but some moments require special attention. Some examples of special ritual moments include the presentation of the holy oils on Holy Thursday; the veneration of the cross on Good Friday; acclamations after the blessing of water at the Easter Vigil. I have come to a greater appreciation of music composed specifically for these ritual moments because it has to be of quality, bearing the weight of the formality and solemnity of the moment, and capable of being a vessel to connect the community with the transcendent. The many different ritual pieces of music together form a corpus of music that becomes a common language that the community knows by heart and enables them to fully participate in those rites year after year.

Music for Mass is special because it is used in tandem with ritual action. The 2008 USCCB document “Sing to the Lord: Music in Divine Worship” outlines three judgements to use in determining appropriate music for worship: music that is musically, ritually, and pastorally appropriate. Hymns that were musically, ritually, and pastorally appropriate in the past may no longer be appropriate because of changes in the culture and the community. What you ate in your twenties will probably not be what you eat in your fifties, owing to changes in your understanding of nutrition and your bodily needs. The diet of liturgical music that a congregation subsists on can and should change over time, hopefully getting better at expressing truth and leading us closer to God. And better means new!

New music for liturgy is in best practice chosen intentionally, introduced infrequently, and repeated so that it becomes familiar. In the months ahead we will get to learn some new music, all as a part of maintaining a dynamic repertoire that serves our community in the best way possible. One of our mass settings – the collection of ordinary mass acclamations that we repeat each week – needs retiring, and so we will be learning a new one as a community this fall. There will be other new music, again incorporated intentionally and infrequently. But we’ll still sing our old favorites too, and someday those new songs will be favorites that we know by heart!

Confirmation Candidates and their Saint Reports: This year all our confirmation candidates were asked to write a saint report. We asked that each Confirmation candidate write about what attracted them to the saint they had chosen. We asked them to reflect on why their chosen saint chose to step forward and in some instances risk their lives to make the name of Jesus Christ known and loved. These candidates did not disappoint. They were introspective about how examining the life of the saint they had chosen brought them to reflect on their own faith journey. Confirmation will take place at the parish on Sunday, June 6th at 2 pm.

First Eucharist Weekend: Next Weekend 17 young children will receive Jesus for the first time in the Eucharist. There will be one child at the 5 pm Mass on Saturday, May 15th, two children at the 10:30AM Mass on Sunday, May 16th and the rest of the children will receive their First Eucharist at a group Mass at 2 pm on May 16th. Please pray that these children stay connected to the Eucharist and the Mass all of their lives.

The social justice commission is looking for volunteers and donations for the community garden—soon to be renamed Mary’s garden: As we wait for the garden to once again take shape next to the lower parking lot, we must focus on what the garden has always been—an outreach project to support Neighbors Inc. food shelf. We need people to donate their extra seedlings, plants and seeds for the garden. We have asked Neighbors Inc. what kind of produce they would need for this year and zucchini, squash and cherry tomatoes did not make the cut. They already receive plenty of those. We need pepper plants of all kinds, regular tomatoes plants, beans, cucumbers, eggplant, leafy greens, broccoli and cauliflower. You can bring your donation to the parish the first week of May. We also need volunteers to tend the garden. If you would like to help plant, weed, harvest or deliver produce from the garden to Neighbors Inc. please contact Teresa Neuman at tneuman@churchofstpatrik.com. Gardening is a great activity for families. We welcome family involvement. You can volunteer for a week in the summer, a day to plant or once a week for any month, June, July and August.

Mary’s Garden is underway at St. Patrick’s: Our facilities staff has been hard at work shifting soil and starting the reframing of the community garden growing boxes that will be renamed in honor of our Blessed Mother. A statue of the Virgin Mary is on her way from Italy. Please take some time and look at the drawings for the garden on display in the gathering space. If you would like to contribute to making the garden space a reality, please make your check out to St. Patrick’s with “Mary’s Garden” in the memo space. We are accepting donations in honor of family members as well. Please pray for the success of this project.

Vacation Bible School is being planned for onsite learning the week of July 26th to July 30th: “Treasured-Where children discover they are priceless to God” is the Vacation Bible School we will be having onsite this July. Children will attend from 9am to 12noon each day. We will have singing, crafts, bible stories, skits, hands on learning and games. The price is \$30.00 per child which includes a t-shirt and a music CD. 
