## From the Finance Council

In January 2020, the Church of St Patrick held several all-parish meetings. These meetings were well attended and quite a few comment cards were returned. The Finance Council is addressing the finance related comments in this article.

**Why are there so many second collections?** This is not a parish decision. The Archdiocese determines when second collections occur.

**What is our Archdiocesan assessment?** The Code of Canon Law, Canon 1263, provides that “after the Diocesan Bishop has heard the Finance Council and the Presbyteral Council, he has the right to impose a moderate assessment for the needs of the Diocese.” This Canon further states that the assessment is to be proportionate to income.

The assessment rate in the Archdiocese of St Paul and Minneapolis is 9%, reduced to 8% for parishes with schools, which includes those parishes that support a regional school, parochial elementary or catholic high school, by contributing at least 15 percent of their plate and envelope collections. The cemetery operations are excluded from the Archdiocesan assessment.

**Encourage contributions by Electronic Funds Transfer.** In the fall of 2020, our church asked parishioners to use Electronic Funds Transfer to make contributions. As a result, forty families switched to EFT bringing the total number of families on EFT to 261.

**What is planned giving?** Planned giving is a donation given by instructions in wills and trusts. Please contact the parish office at 651-455-6624 for more information.

**Rent out space that is not used.** Events in Shamrock or Emerald Hall have been St Pat’s main source of rental income. All space is used during the school year which limits other space available for rent.

**What about cutting expenses to match income?** St Patrick’s makes a concerted effort to efficiently manage expenses. The Corporate Board is concerned that cutting too deeply will reduce services thus cutting membership and participation. Lower church membership will result in less income and the need for continued spending cuts: like a vortex effect.

**Don’t shame or guilt people into contributing.** Know that the church has no fund raising strategy using shame or guilt. Shame and guilt are feelings unique to individuals. Sometimes feelings arise from what is said or written.

**What will the parish do with the savings from refinancing the loan?** St Patrick’s accounts payable last January stood at \$95,000. The savings in principal and interest from the refinance are about \$8,000 per month and this will help keep our accounts payable current.

Thank you for your participation in the meetings and your comments or questions. Many members of the parish have stepped up their contributions during the pandemic. Because of your efforts, St Patrick’s is in better financial shape than a year ago. We thank you for your generosity.

**Mask and Distancing Requirement to End May 28:** Based on guidance from the Minnesota Department of Health, the Archdiocese of St. Paul and Minneapolis and the Center for Disease Control (CDC), the Church of St. Patrick will no longer require masks for fully vaccinated individuals who wish to attend meetings, daily and weekend Masses, and visit our campus beginning May 28, 2021. In addition, social distance and capacity requirements will be lifted beginning May 28, 2021. Gatherings involving primarily children and youth will continue to require face masks as directed by the organizations listed above. For more information, please contact the parish office. Visitors to St. Patrick’s Church are welcome to wear masks as they feel comfortable. Current facility cleaning and sanitization protocols will remain in effect until further notice.

**New Website coming by June 1:** The Administration Commission has been hard at work building a new website for our parish. Our current website has not been changed since 2010 and was in need of some updates in navigation and security. Please be patient as this new website is launched by June 1. **Confirmation Candidates and their Saint Reports:** This year all our confirmation candidates were asked to write a saint report. We asked that each Confirmation candidate write about what attracted them to the saint they had chosen. We asked them to reflect on why their chosen saint chose to step forward and in some instances risk their lives to make the name of Jesus Christ known and loved. These candidates did not disappoint. They were introspective about how examining the life of the saint they had chosen brought them to reflect on their own faith journey. Please watch for future excerpts from their saint reports in the bulletin and a display of the reports in the gathering space beginning on May 24. Confirmation will take place at the parish on Sunday, June 6<sup>th</sup> at 2 pm.

**The social justice commission is looking for volunteers and donations for the community garden—soon to be renamed Mary’s garden:** As we wait for the garden to once again take shape next to the lower parking lot, we must focus on what the garden has always been—an outreach project to support Neighbors Inc. food shelf. We need people to donate their extra seedlings, plants and seeds for the garden. We have asked Neighbors Inc. what kind of produce they would need for this year and zucchini, squash and cherry tomatoes did not make the cut. They already receive plenty of those. We need pepper plants of all kinds, regular tomatoes plants, beans, cucumbers, eggplant, leafy greens, broccoli and cauliflower. You can bring your donation to the parish the first week of May. We also need volunteers to tend the garden. If you would like to help plant, weed, harvest or deliver produce from the garden to Neighbors Inc. please contact Teresa Neuman at [tneuman@churchofstpatrik.com](mailto:tneuman@churchofstpatrik.com). Gardening is a great activity for families. We welcome family involvement. You can volunteer for a week in the summer, a day to plant or once a week for any month, June, July and August.

**Mary’s Garden is underway at St. Patrick’s:** Our facilities staff has been hard at work shifting soil and starting the reframing of the community garden growing boxes that will be renamed in honor of our Blessed Mother. A statue of the Virgin Mary is on her way from Italy. Please take some time and look at the drawings for the garden on display in the gathering space. If you would like to contribute to making the garden space a reality, please make your check out to St. Patrick’s with “Mary’s Garden” in the memo space. We are accepting donations in honor of family members as well. Please pray for the success of this project.

**Vacation Bible School is being planned for onsite learning the week of July 26<sup>th</sup> to July 30<sup>th</sup>:** “Treasured-Where children discover they are priceless to God” is the Vacation Bible School we will be having onsite this July. Children will attend from 9am to 12noon each day. We will have singing, crafts, bible stories, skits, hands on learning and games. The price is \$30.00 per child which includes a t-shirt and a music CD. **SEEKING HELP TO BUILD AND PLANT THE VEGETABLE GARDEN ASSOCIATED WITH MARY’S GARDEN:** Do you have building skills? Would you be willing to donate some of your time to help us build raised beds for the vegetable garden? We are also seeking volunteers to plant, weed and harvest the garden over the summer. Confirmation candidates and families are encouraged to come forward. You can volunteer for a week or several weeks during the growing season. 



### **You Don’t Have What It Takes — but You Will**

Those of us in ministry love this saying: God doesn’t call the equipped. He equips the called. We all know that sort of queasy feeling we get in the pit of our stomachs when it becomes clear what we’re supposed to do, in any situation. It’s that feeling of: Oh, no. Not me. Not now. I can’t. We’ve all got our list of reasons why not, don’t we? We do it for everything, from big life problems to small everyday choices. I’m not going to invite my neighbor to church because I don’t want to come across as pushy. I’m not going to make amends with my cousin because she’ll just walk all over me again. I’m not going to say a Rosary tonight because I’m tired and it’ll just stress me out.

However, even if we all put our lists of “reasons why we can’t” together, I don’t think any of us have reasons quite as valid as the apostles. Their job was to convert the nations — and here they are, a bunch of fishermen who haven’t been out of Judea, who speak only their own languages. Were they supposed to preach the Gospel via a particularly compelling game of charades? But even that big, giant, stop-you-dead-in-your tracks Reason Why We Can’t was nothing, because God had a plan. He didn’t call a bunch of equipped men. He called them, and He equipped them. Cue the tongues of fire!

God doesn’t call us to do His will because we have what it takes. He calls us because He’s ready to give us what it takes. Being a good steward is to answer the call of Christ knowing he will provide. — Tracy Earl Welliver, MTS ©LPi


