A NOTE FROM OUR DIRECTOR OF PASTORAL MINISTRY



A WEDDING, BAPTISM AND SOME GIFTS Here we are, the Second Sunday of Ordinary Time, with Christmas in the rear-view mirror already. We now find ourselves in the midst

of the doldrums of winter. With the cold weather, increased COVID cases, and seemingly the same news stories from a year ago, this year doesn't feel too much different than last. And, to be honest, I find myself convicted by that fact.

We just finished rejoicing at Christmas—the moment we pause to praise God that He saw fit to come to earth as a child. This is supposed to change things—we are not alone. Our God is truly with us (Emmanuel). This is supposed to make all the difference in the world, and yet, for many, December 26 was no different than December 23 and 2022 is just another year not too different than

2021. I have been reflecting on why this seems to be the mentality, if not exactly embraced, at the very least is accepted by our broader culture and, even more detrimentally, tolerated by those of us in the Church. I would like to offer an "aha" moment that in part responds to this tendency.

Here in America, Christmas is allimportant, but Epiphany is not really celebrated with much fanfare. Of course we like to see the Three Kings moved into the Sanctuary or like to sing "Oh star of wonder, star of light ... " But as you go around the world, Epiphany is celebrated with much more gusto than here. As I was pondering this fact and asking "why?", I read an article that opened my eyes to the importance of this feast. At Christmas, we celebrate Jesus's humanity. But at Epiphany, Jesus reveals that He is divine. In other words, we celebrate that in the person of Jesus, God takes on flesh, and we see His humanity animated by His divinity. We most closely associate Epiphany with the coming of the Ma-

gi, who bring their royal gifts. But the Epiphany also celebrates the Baptism of Jesus and the wedding feast at Cana. It's no accident that January 2 we heard the Gospel about the kings, January 9 the Gospel spoke about Jesus's baptism, and in today's Gospel we read about the wedding feast of Cana. All three of these events are "aha" moments whereby Jesus is revealed to not simply be a human being (which he is), but also fully Divine. As we enter into this season of "ordinary time," where we are tempted to only see the ordinary human stuff of our daily lives, let us remember that through our own baptism, we were made adopted sons and daughters of God, and the same Divinity that is manifest in Jesus is at work through the Holy Spirit in and through your life, too. Seeing life through this lens, this year won't just be another run-of-the-mill repeat, but an exciting adventure where God is at work.


