#### A NOTE FROM OUR SCHOOL PRINCIPAL

#### SAINT JOHN'S OFFICES CLOSED MONDAY


Just a note that the Parish and School offices will be closed Monday, January 24, for an all-staff retreat. There will be no Communion Service.
