Last week we celebrated Catholic Schools Week, which provides an opportunity for us to turn some attention to our parish's primary ministry, the school that's attached to this church building and the

hundreds of future Catholics we have the opportunity to help form right now. If you were here for Mass last weekend, you might have heard me reference some of this already. The spiritual welfare of these young people is in our care, and of our utmost responsibility, my friends, and I consider it a personal privilege to get to speak and interact with these youngsters regularly. We *all* have this opportunity, if we choose to take it

We are at the highest enrollment we've been at in more than a decade, at 225 students currently enrolled in the preschool through eighth-grade programs. Almost all of our returning families have fully enrolled for next fall, and more are still registering for both this year and next year. We could possibly reach our maximum of 250 students in September.

Of these students, something like 45 percent of them are not Catholic. WOW! We have the daily chance to share encounters with Christ's true presence, in the Eucharist and in our church, with all of our Christian neighbors. We are learning and growing with them every day. It is beautiful to see the Holy Spirit working in all of our families, in the beauty of the diversity of their backgrounds and their personal outlooks.

One of the premiere offerings we have here at Saint John's is our year-round preschool program. This is a big deal, as PreK is not only a feeder to our K-8 program, it is a rare opportunity to ensure our children have the most comprehensive preparation for kindergarten possible, offering summer programming that's intentional and specific to this age group. Additionally, academic excellence is always a theme when we speak about the school; that said, in the past four years in particular, I've noticed an increase in the number of kids who have

individual learning plans and accentuated literacy opportunities, that we are now serving in a way that we couldn't before. With the addition of Wilson, Believe and Read, and I understand another new computer literacy program, we really are leaders in literacy, and literacy is the critical key to all learning.

Lastly, we have such a busy building, folks! Between the athletics that's back in full swing, a thriving middle school youth group and faith formation extending from the parish into the school, a new art program called "Young Rembrandts" and Lego Club starting this spring, Annie Jr. play rehearsals that partner with a number of local Catholic schools, and general day-to-day after school care, our campus is buzzing! Please be sure to ask about these offerings, and attend one of the next Saint John's School events. The annual Gala is coming up April 22; perhaps donate or save the date and witness first-hand how we are cultivating future Christian Catholics right here in Little Canada.


