The Crosier Fathers were founded by St. Theodore in Belgium in the year 1210. The Order has spread its spirituality focused on the "triumphant cross of Christ and our glorified Lord" all over the world for over 800 years. The Crosiers have just celebrated their 100 year anniversary of ministering to the people of the Democratic Republic of the Congo.

The Congo has experienced great strife for many decades, in recent years it has been fueled by the control of the rich mineral mines in the eastern part of the country. It is in this part of the country that the Crosiers are building a school for those who are in most need. 


Amplifying Black Voices Fr. Augustus Tolton

God can make a way out of no way – it's a phrase I heard often a couple of years back on the racial justice pilgrimage to Selma and Montgomery with our friends from St. Peter Claver. Those words also remind me of the life and witness of Fr. Augustus Tolton, the first Black Catholic priest in America.

Born into slavery in Missouri in 1854, Tolton's mother orchestrated his escape and nurtured his faith. His desire to enter priestly formation was thwarted when not a single U.S. seminary would admit him; in 1880, he left for Italy to begin his studies, assuming he would never return to America. After his ordination, however, he was sent to Illinois saying, "Must I go back to America, where I was not wanted as a priest?" He persevered and later began the first Black Catholic community in Chicago at St. Monica Church, which still thrives today as a parish that is home to a number of strong and varied ethnic groups, each celebrating their unique cultures and traditions.

"I shall work and pull at it as long as God gives me life," Tolton said of his ministry.



"We should welcome all people into the church, not send them away."

Sadly, Tolton died unexpectedly of heat stroke when he was only 43. Today, he is on the path to sainthood.

This week, I invite you to recall a time when life took an unexpected turn. Like Tolton, did you end up somewhere you never thought you'd be? What was difficult about that? What was life-giving? Did someone accompany you along the way? How did God help you to make a way out of no way?

Administrator's Corner

Stewardship Message

Today's readings remind us of how our God is compassionate and passionately loves us.

"Woe to the shepherds who mislead and scatter the flock of my pasture, says the Lord." Our First Reading from the prophet Jeremiah addresses false prophets who had misled God's people away from the Lord. The Lord declares that He will restore His people by bringing back those who have gone astray and providing for them new shepherds so that they will "no longer fear and tremble."

This reading portrays God's infinite care and concern for our lives. We can see that God is the one who loved us first. Oftentimes, we are like the people who are blind to His goodness and enticed by sin — something we think will make us happy but does not. God is the one who constantly pursues us and gives us opportunities to say "yes" to Him. He wants to win us back, and ultimately, He will make us happy.

So, we must ask ourselves, who or what is blinding us or leading us away from our ultimate happiness? Stop for a moment and name that thing — money, status, a person, career, laziness, addiction, self-image, health, etc. — that could be leading you away from a full and happy relationship with God.

As Christian disciples, deep down we really know that our true happiness is God. So, what are we waiting for? Take the leap of faith and allow yourself to radically love God in return.

As we begin this new week, let us name the things in our lives that are robbing us of our ultimate happiness, work to let go of them and let us strive to make Jesus our true shepherd by seeking Him in our daily lives.



Today's Pearl

Want to know what to say to someone who has lost someone dear to them? The one thing I hear over and over from people who are grieving is how they wish people knew that they actually *like* it when people talk about the loved one who died. It may make them sad, but often in a good way, that they would welcome. No one wants to forget the person who died. No, if we let ME represent those grieving the loss of a loved one, I would *like* the memory of that person's very important life to be *kept alive* through stories and by bringing the person's name up in normal conversation. It may be harder for me to learn to live with my loss, if the folks around me never talk about my loved one for fear of making me sadder. Oftentimes that can be more about those around me not being comfortable with me expressing my grief in a normal, healthy way.

Want to help? Share your memories about the one who died. It really can be more like a warm blanket of good memories wrapping around me – a welcomed feeling – even if I cry.


