



Pastoral Pearls



Each of us is called by our Baptism to BE the Love of God to those around us – anyone we encounter. And since those around us will at times have a need for more tender care, I thought I would pass on some brief, concise "Pearls" or "Tools" to help us be that Love of God.



TODAY'S PEARL

Life doesn't always go the way we'd like it to. Sometimes things change that are out of our control and it throws us off balance. We may feel lost or angry or sad or frustrated or confused. What is your go-to way to respond? Are you a *reactor*? Do you become loudly angry, or quietly seething, look for people with whom to stoke this fire or share your anxiety? Or are you a *ponderer*? You are slow to anger, willing to be patient, try to understand, and watch how things shake out? Do you usually run or stick with it?

I've dealt with a lot of this kind of situation in my life and have found it more effective for me to make myself be patient; to try to find out what makes things the way they are - what might I not yet know about that is influencing this situation, what is the need driving the decisions being made? I try to understand rather than judge too quickly. It is helpful to understand that all I can really do is to speak my truth respectfully and let go of the outcome (because I really have no control over that.) This takes the pressure off me and brings a sense of calm. This work well for me within family situations, work situations, conflict in working with people I hire for services, or even neighbors. I have learned that it is so much more effective to work *with* people rather than blame or fight for my own way or discount someone else's perspective. Where might this come in handy in *your* life? Ultimately it is about trusting God and knowing that only God can really make sense out of our messy lives and troubling

situations. With God, it will turn out fine, but I love how this quote reminds us that "fine" might not be what we expect. This challenges me to be open – to let go of my preconceived notions - and stretches me to grow. These ideas are just that – ideas. How you ultimately respond to such situations is up to you, of course. Inviting God's Holy Spirit into the process just sometimes makes it more loving and peace-filled.

*Loving God, send your Spirit to me to fill me with patience, caring, and openness to how YOU will work through the difficult situations that face me.
When I want to be angry or run away or blame, fill me with calm, and understanding, and gentleness.
Help me to not jump to conclusions so quickly, but instead patiently seek understanding.
May I be open to what you define as "fine." ~Amen.*

Amplifying Black Voices: Gloria Purvis (Part III)



For the past couple of weeks I have been sharing the wisdom of Gloria Purvis – if you’ve missed either of those articles and would like to catch up, previous bulletins can be found on the parish website. This week, more about her reflections on the experience of talking about building a culture of life from the perspective of working for racial justice.

Purvis is clear in her conviction that any definition of being pro-life must necessarily include those “outside the womb.” She speaks painfully about her experience of talking with Catholic friends about the murder of George Floyd and those that would ask her why she wasn’t also talking about Floyd’s previous drug use or his previous arrest. Others would say that the “real” issue was “Black-on-Black” crime, a term she finds offensive. “When was the last time we referred to white-on-white crime?” she asked. She talks of her need to find support and commonality with other Catholics on the full spectrum of human life and dignity and instead finding those who could not see George Floyd as truly deserving of that.

“A year later,” she says, “I’m still not healed from that. I’m still reeling from that. Racism has infected a lot of people in the church. It’s thriving and it’s in our church. I want them to be free of it.” How do we deal with this polarization in the church when it comes to race? **“Call it out,”** Purvis says.

She is clear that she is not giving up, not sitting down.

This week, I invite you to search out a Purvis podcast and hear her prophetic voice for yourself. She never fails to make me think about the clarity of my own witness. She may challenge you, too. It’s worth your time.

Administrator's Corner

Stewardship Message: Our readings today call us to pause for a moment and consider how we respond to God's love for us each day.

Our Gospel recounts a dialogue between the Pharisees and Jesus. The Pharisees questioned why Jesus' disciples did not practice the ritual washing before eating a meal.

Jesus' response reminds us to ask ourselves 'why.' Why do we remain faithful to God's commands? Why do we pray or go to Mass? Why do we participate in the sacraments? Why do we love others?

Often, we are living our faith a certain way out of obligation, fear, or duty. But Jesus reminds us that the greatest way to live out our faith is through love. Our faith has obligations to provide us opportunities to love, honor, and praise the Lord. They are meant to aid us on our personal journey with Jesus Christ.

St. James reminds us that every moment of each day is an opportunity to respond to God's infinite love for us with love and gratitude in return.

If we approach our relationship with Jesus with this in mind, then we begin to realize that the gift of the Mass is an opportunity to worship God, the sacraments are ways to draw us closer to Him and His commandments are opportunities to love Him more faithfully.

And if we approach our day-to-day moments with this in mind, then we begin to see just how many blessings God has given us. Looking at life through the lens of gratitude helps us to see each moment as a gift with endless opportunities to respond in love.

This is how we ought to live our lives as Christian stewards — by recognizing our lives as a gift and an opportunity to love God in response to how He has loved us.
