Pastoral Pearls



Each of us is called by our Baptism to BE the Love of God to those around us – anyone we encounter. And since those around us will at times have a need for more tender care,

I thought I would pass on some brief, concise "Pearls" or "Tools" to help us be that Love of God.

TODAY'S PEARL:



I love this sentiment. Knowing that God calls us above all to "Love one another," I forget that sometimes the smallest thing can offer the warmest love. I know how I feel when people greet me with a smile – warm, noticed, worthy of a kind gesture, acknowledged. Even if I don't know the person – or maybe especially if I don't know

them – it makes me remember that today can be a good day; that I can pass this good feeling along; that God is smiling down on me, and all will be well. Wow! That's a lot of power within a tiny, ordinary gesture. It also brings to mind the old saying, "A smile can turn a frown upside down." Funny saying; grand accomplishment! This concept ties in beautifully, too, with the *Health and Wellness Kindness Campaign or Challenge*. A smile is something anyone can do, and is a great way to jump start your own experiments in Kindness . I remember as a junior high youth, walking around Lake Harriet and smiling at EVERYBODY, and saying "Hi." It was so fun and funny too. I loved seeing the variety of responses this small smile brought out in people – not all were positive, but all were intriguing. Some were just mystified that I would smile and say help to them. It can be a very fun thing to do. I wonder what responses you might get from your radiant smile??!!

Loving God, please form my mouth into a smile, that travels to my eyes & bubbles from my heart. May all the love that you are constantly showering upon me shine out from within me through a smile and kind hello to those I meet through my day. May joy be the by-product of this simple gesture of love – for the recipient as well as for myself. Thank you for the capacity to love through smiles and kind words. Amen.

Administrator's Corner

Stewardship Message: In our Gospel today, we hear the story of a man who ran up to Jesus and asked Him what he must do to reach eternal life. Jesus said, "You are lacking in one thing. Go, sell what you have, and give to the poor and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me." It says the man went away sad because he had much. We might cringe when we hear this story because it is sad — this man was so close to becoming an active disciple of Jesus, but instead turned away. We also might cringe because it could be deeply applicable to our lives. Jesus states that "It is easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle than for one who is rich to enter the kingdom of God." One of the metaphors for the "eye of a needle" was a tight passageway into Jerusalem that people had to enter to get into the city. In order for their camels to pass through, they had to remove whatever the camel was carrying, only then, could they enter. If we look at our own lives, we can most likely think of something that we tightly carry with us. Maybe it is possessions — material goods or money — like Jesus references in our Gospel. Or maybe it is something less material — like status, pride, or control. Jesus doesn't want our stuff — our job promotions, our designer house, or our bank account. He just wants us. So, we need to be willing to strip those things from our lives in order to reach Him. It might seem difficult, but the outcome will be more than we could have ever imagined — peace on earth and treasure in heaven. **The Catholic Steward**



Fall Festival Update: The Core Team will be having our Fall Festival wrap up meeting and celebration this month. We feel we accomplished our goal of bringing the community back together in spite of the challenges of dealing with COVID. There will be a

more detailed report in the upcoming November Angel News, but we came very close to meeting our financial goal. Our preliminary net proceeds are around \$110,000 which is over \$12,000 better than last year and just \$5,000 under budget. Thank you again to all who volunteered and supported the Festival this year!

2022 Stewardship Campaign: This weekend we kick off our 2022 Stewardship Campaign by asking parishioners to fill out their financial commitment card for next year. Everyone at Mass will have a chance to fill out their commitment card during Mass. All families who have not responded by October 24 will be mailed a letter from Fr. Joe along with their commitment card the week of October 25. We ask that you return your card even if you are not going to pledge at this time in order to save time and expense for follow up mailings. Thank you!

The **Time and Talent** stewardship weekend, **October 16-17**, will focus on the specific volunteer needs of each of the many ministries in our parish. As in past years, we will

have time and talent cards available to all who are attending Mass that will give you an opportunity to sign up or to find more information on the over 60 ministries in our parish. Along with the signup form, a brief description will be included. We are also encouraging you to go to guardian-angels.org/give to fill out the form online. If you are not getting the weekly parish emails, just call Cindy at the front desk, and she will see that you are added to the almost 1,300 that are currently receiving it.

Archdiocesan Synod: Last week we held our first sessions last Monday at 6:00 pm and Wednesday at 9:00 a.m. in Peter O'Neill Hall. We had good attendance at both sessions in which the content was the same. This schedule will continue for five more weeks ending on November 8 and 10. This week's session will be covering "**Life-long Discipleship**" and "**Universal Call to Holiness**". No RSVP needed, just show up and participate in helping form the future direction of our parish and Archdiocese.

Music Director Update: We have a new Director of Music and Liturgy, **Zack Stachowski**. Zack will begin full time on December 1 and start part time on October 11. Between now and then, he will take care of his obligations at his current parish. Please check out the November Angels News for an introduction to Zack. We would like to thank **Mary Dinesen**, our accompanist and organist, and **Will Pitts** for making sure we had music at all Masses over the past couple of months. Their extra time and effort is very much appreciated. We would also like to thank the following cantors: **Jim Christenson, Aimee Petra, Mara Pieper, Will Pitts, Tom Rasmussen, John Riehle, and Viky Turner** for stepping up to improve our Mass experience.


