Pastoral Pearls



Each of us is called by our Baptism to BE the Love of God to those around us – anyone we encounter. And since those around us will at times have a need for more tender care,

I thought I would pass on some brief, concise "Pearls" or "Tools" to help us be that Love of God.

TODAY'S PEARL:

Never underestimate the difference you can make in the lives of others. Step forward, reach out, and help. Reach out to someone that might need a lift.

I love this sentiment. Why does grief hurt so much? Because I loved so deeply. What a gift that is, to have loved so deeply that it feels like a part of me has been ripped away. It makes me want to hold onto a person so tightly, because I don't want to lose that miracle of such true love. I want to

keep "enjoying" my loved one forever. I have often heard people deeply in love say, "You can't die first, it has to be *me*, so I don't have to live without you." We know a good thing when we have it, and the love that causes deep grief is truly a gift from God, that we can never lose. But it's hard to see past the hurt to acknowledge that blessing. It takes time – however much is needed. The people I loved whom I have lost stay with me, and return to tickle my memories from time to time, teasing out a smile from me, however reluctant. And that is as it should be. If my loved one has truly "become part of me," as wise Helen Keller believes, I can reassure myself that I never need to "get over" the losing of their life-giving Spirit. I can be comforted in knowing and *feeling* them right there inside me – hearing their words in my head, seeing a beloved facial expression in my mind's eye, almost feeling a loving caress that I remember so well.

When All Saints' and All Souls' Days roll around, we have an opportunity to honor and remember the loved ones who have passed away. I invite you to attend one of our All Saint', All Souls' Day Masses, November 1, and November 2, where we will try to honor our deceased loved ones in a special way. It can be truly soothing to the soul.

Loving God, thank you for the gift of the time I had to spend with _____, who was so close to me and whom I still mourn. Thank you for all the ways this person is still with me – part of me - and help me to be able to feel and recognize their presence. Walk with me as I travel my journey of grief from heartbreak to heartache to recognition that this person so loved, is not lost to me, but part of me. Amen.

Remember Loved Ones who have passed away at our All Souls' Day 7:00pm Mass.

Our All Souls' Mass remembers in a special way those who have passed away this past year (since last Oct.). **ALL are welcomed.** If the Funeral of your loved one has *not* been held here at Guardian Angels, we most likely do *not* know about that death. You are still invited to our All Souls' Day Mass, and to participate in the ritual for those loved ones. We will be lighting candles with their name on it and bringing the candles to the altar during the Litany of Souls. These candles are then for you to take home with you.

* **If the funeral of your loved one was not held here**, and you plan on attending to honor and remember that person, we ask you to please **let MaryPat Potts know**, by emailing her (mpotts@guardian-angels.org) or calling the church office. Note: we will be reading the names off of those whose funerals were held here, but most likely NOT those whose funerals were elsewhere, due to the logistics of creating the list for the Litany.

Administrator's Corner

Stewardship Message: Today's Gospel presents Jesus' teachings on the two greatest commandments. Love the Lord with all your heart, soul, mind, and strength. And love your neighbor as yourself. Let's consider these "greatest commandments" as they relate to three aspects of a Christian steward's daily life — the giving of our time, talent, and treasure. The use of time refers primarily to our relationship with the Lord — in other words, our prayer life. It is vital to talk to God throughout the day, but if I really want to love Him with all my heart, soul, mind, and strength, shouldn't I make time for God "first" on my agenda each day? Not as an afterthought, but as a time I have intentionally chosen to spend only with Him. The use of talents refers to the way I offer the abilities, skills, and interests the Lord has given me for the good of those around me. Doing so is a practical way to "love my neighbor as myself." At the same time, it is also a way to love the Lord with all that I am and have, since He has told us that whatever we do for others we are also doing for Him. The use material gifts — or treasure — likewise demonstrates both love of God and of neighbor. When I trustingly offer a sacrificial gift to God through the offertory collection, I am showing Him in a very tangible way that He comes before all else in my life and I am putting my material resources at the service of my neighbor in the parish community and beyond. When we live for God and others, we are living a stewardship way of life. And like the wise scribe in today's Gospel, we are moving closer to the kingdom of God, our ultimate destination. **The Catholic Steward**

2022 Stewardship Campaign: We have received **210** cards from parishioners who have picked up and returned their 2022 Stewardship campaign commitment cards. This past week we mailed out commitment cards and a letter from Fr. Joe to all parishioners who have not returned a card. We have 1,800 families in the parish, and we normally receive around 800 responses, 100 of which indicate they are unable to commit. So, in addition to the 700 who do fill out their cards with a commitment, we have over 600 families make contributions throughout the year that don't fill out cards. We thank all 1,300 families for their continued financial stewardship support of our parish. Please send in your cards as soon as possible because we will begin our budgeting process soon and we use the results of the stewardship campaign to determine budgeted revenue. We also want to encourage families who are not taking advantage of electronic giving to consider doing so. Close to 50% of our collections come in through electronic giving. If interested in finding out more about EFT from your checking or savings account, automatic payments from your credit card or through the sale of stock, please contact Heidi or me.

GA Perks: Our new coffee shop and gathering space had a great "soft" opening over the last couple of weeks. We are still waiting for our new coffee machine to arrive which is similar the one we have in POH. There will be coffee available 24/7 when GA Perks is open. If you have not checked out GA Perks, why not take a stroll down the

school building hallway, get a cup of coffee, tea, etc., and a baked item from our **Baking for a Purpose** ministry.

Archdiocesan Synod: This coming week's Synod topics for **Session #5** will be **Parents as the primary educators (birth – adult)** and **Helping the young encounter Jesus (birth – grade 6)**. Both of these topics will be covered on **Monday, November 1 at 6:00 pm and Wednesday, November 3 at 9:00 am**. All of the Synod sessions are "stand alone" so parishioners can attend all sessions or just attend the ones that are of interest to you. These sessions are excellent, so we hope you are able to attend all, but don't stay away if you missed the first couple. There will be a total of six sessions in all and at Guardian Angels they will always be on the Mondays and Wednesdays.

New Challenge: Let's see if we can fill the **Aluminum Can Bin** before Thanksgiving. As a reminder, the net proceeds for recycling all those cans is split with two-thirds given to our Boy Scout Troop 817 to offset some of their camping expenses and the remainder is used to offset the grounds maintenance expenses. Please help fill the bin with not only your cans but those from relatives, neighbors, and friends. Thank you!

Did You Know: That we now have **1,801** registered households compared to 1,793 last year at this time and **5,196** registered parishioners compared to 5,189 last year. Mass counts this year for the month of October averaged **650** for all three Masses compared to 1,168 in 2019 (pre-COVID).




