


### Pastoral Pearls


some other fun gifts, too. We will also need help with gift cards for those who come to the parish looking for a bit of help.




### Love Builds Bridges, Not Walls

## Administrator's Corner

**Stewardship Message:** On this last Sunday of Ordinary Time for the liturgical year, we celebrate the Feast of Christ the King. This feast was instituted by Pope Pius XI in 1925, at a time when the world was experiencing a rise of secularism, materialism and individualism, and an increasing denial of Christ's existence and authority.

The hope was that the establishment of this feast would accomplish three goals: that nations would see that the Church has the right to freedom, that leaders and nations would see that they are required to give respect to Christ, the King of kings, and that the faithful would be strengthened and encouraged by the reminder that Christ must reign in our hearts, minds, wills, and bodies.

This feast is needed more than ever for all people and for us especially, as Christian stewards. It reminds us of three vital truths. First, even when it seems the world is spinning out of control, we need not fear because we have a King of kings who is very much in charge and who is loving, merciful and just. Second, if Christ is king of all, then He is also king of me, personally. I am not "lord" of my time, talents, and treasure. He is. I am a servant of the King and a steward of His gifts to me. Third, as His disciple, I am called to imitate my King. Christ's kingship is characterized by humble service, by emptying Himself for the good of others, The Scriptures tell us He went about doing good and He says of Himself, "I came not to be served but to serve." How can I live in any other way than as a humble servant like my King? **The Catholic Steward**

**2022 Stewardship Campaign:** We have received **523** cards from parishioners as of November 12. In just two weeks, we have fallen behind last year in number of responses and amount pledged. Our goal is to receive 850 responses including those who are unable to commit at this time. Please send in your cards whether you are able to make a commitment or not. Please see the back of the commitment card for a place to sign up for EFT or automatic giving. If

interested in finding out more about EFT from your checking or savings account, automatic payments from your credit card or through the sale of stock, please contact Heidi or me. We had high hopes for the **Time & Talent** response. To date we have only received 76 responses compared to over 200 in 2019. Because of the pandemic, we did not have a Time and Talent sign up opportunity in 2020. We are now at a critical point in getting volunteers in many areas, **especially for weekend Masses.** The Friday Fish Fry Core Team is currently discerning whether we only do drive up sales again this year. This consideration is not because of COVID but for the worry of not having the volunteers to put on a successful event. This year's Fall Festival was a good indicator of the problem as we had to reduce event hours and eliminate some events. We are trying to determine if the lack of volunteers is solely caused by COVID; or, with our aging parishioners, is it burnout or are volunteers spread too thin? As with many parishes, it might simply be our next generation of volunteers has not materialized, and we may need to scale everything back. The staff and the Parish council will be in serious discussions over the next six months on addressing fewer volunteers. We have included the Time and Talent information with the Angel News that was mailed last Thursday. Hopefully some of you will respond.

**Update:** Last week we shared information about the repairs we were making to eliminate the water leaking into our electrical panel. Excel was unable to come on Thursday, November 11 to disconnect the power and to install new wires, patch the old holes, and Excel would turn the power back on. We are trying to make a new appointment and hopefully get everything accomplished by Thanksgiving. We will then push all the dirt back into the hole and fix our lawn in the spring.

**Reminder:** As winter conditions become the norm for the next five months, we want to remind everyone to be careful on our sidewalks and

parking lot. Our maintenance team does an excellent job of keeping up with snow removal and then dealing with ice prevention. We would like to suggest that older parishioners and those with trouble walking, that you consider using doors **#2, #4 or #6** to enter the church. The outside walk is much shorter, **#2 and #6** have handicap door openers. Once inside, the rest of your journey to the Worship Space is much warmer and safer. Also, if you arrive early for Mass or want to stay and socialize after Mass, you can stop by GA Perks which is just inside doors **#2 and #4** and enjoy a warm cup of coffee or hot chocolate and a "goodie" from our Baking for a Purpose Ministry.
