TODAY'S PEARL:

Advent is the perfect time for **PAUSE**. Advent is a time to **PAUSE** and contemplate the coming of Christ into our hearts anew. .. to **PAUSE** to assess what Jesus being in my world and life really means, and how I SHOW that in the way I live *my* life ... to **PAUSE** and look for the myriad twinkling's of God's great love and activity in my life... to **PAUSE**, breathe and slow down so I can be present in each wondrous moment ... **PAUSE** to appreciate each person in my life and the world around me, perhaps in the ways suggested by this quote... **PAUSE** to make room for Christ's incarnation into *my* life, open to however he may present himself within me, and to be used by him in whatever way

he may call me to make this world better.

*Loving God, help me to learn to embrace the **PAUSE**, wherein I can meet you and your calling for how you want me to be, now in this moment, and for the people around me. Amen.*

Pope Francis and A Global Economy

In a global virtual address in October, Pope Francis outlined nine compelling calls to reform of a variety of economic sectors. His words are a direct appeal to apply our Catholic social teaching to our global economic structures. In coming weeks, this space will offer for your reflection each of his nine calls. They are challenging, based on a view from the margins of society and rooted in care for each other and for the earth. As you might imagine, there are some who call his words unworkable, or meddling, or outside of his expertise. His response:

We also experience resistance to the changes we need and long for, many forms of resistance that run deep, that are rooted beyond our strength and decisions. They are what the Social Teaching of the Church calls structures of sin; these too we are called to change, and we cannot overlook them in the moment of thinking of how to act. Personal change is necessary, but it is also indispensable to adjust our socio-economic models so that they have a human face, because many models have lost it. And thinking about these situations, I make a pest of myself with my questions. And I go on asking. And I ask everyone in the name of God.

And so in that spirit, this week, his first call regarding the COVID vaccines:

In the name of God, I ask all the great pharmaceutical laboratories to release the patents. Make a gesture of humanity and allow every country, every people, every human being, to have access to the vaccines. There are countries where only three or four per cent of the inhabitants have been vaccinated.

Next week, debt burdens on financially strapped nations.

Administrator's Corner

Stewardship Message: The readings for the Second Week of Advent offer both encouragement and challenge as we reflect and prepare for the two "comings" of Christ — His coming as a baby on the great feast of Christmas, and the anticipation of His second coming at the end of time. Our First Reading, from Baruch, is a wonderful reminder that God has triumphed over sin and death and that we — His faithful disciples — will live in the light of His glory one day. Until He comes again, we must remain faithful to Him as true disciples and good stewards of all the gifts He has given us.

While it can be tempting to give in to the materialism and calls for self-indulgence that surround us, this reading calls us back to the spiritual reality that this life is passing and that we are made for eternal life with God. We are called to prepare for eternal life by the way that we use our time, our talents, and our treasure now. The Gospel reading from Luke shows us how personal and detailed is God's love for humanity as He prepared the way for Christ's coming among us. We are told the precise time, place, and person, John the Baptist, He appointed to announce the arrival of our Savior. John tells us how to celebrate to the fullest this first "coming" on the feast of Christmas and how to prepare for the second coming — through repentance.

This Advent let's turn away from any bad habits or sin that may have crept into our lives and turn our hearts and minds back to Christ. This is what the stewardship way of life is all about — moving closer ever closer in relationship with Christ and imitation of Him, ready to celebrate His birth, with eyes fixed on eternal life with Him. **The Catholic Steward**

IRA Charitable Rollover Reminder: The popular IRA Charitable Rollover is a permanent option available every calendar year. It can be used to fulfill your 2021 pledge, prepay your 2022 pledge, or make an additional yearend donation to our Capital Projects Savings account or to fund a specific Angel List item. Donors, age 70 ½ and older, are eligible to make outright tax free gifts to charities up to \$100,000 annually in total from their IRAs. Please call Heidi or me if you are thinking of donating from your IRA or naming Guardian Angels as a beneficiary of your IRA. Thank you.

2022 Stewardship Campaign: We have received **603** cards from parishioners as of November 29. We continue to be behind last year in number of responses. Our goal is to receive 850 responses including those who are unable to commit at this time. Please send in your cards whether you are able to make a commitment or not. Catholic Services Appeal Foundation (CSAF) Update: We would be grateful if everyone who has not completed their 2021 CSAF pledge to do so by **December 31** for us to maximize our rebate of all money collected. We are currently eligible to receive 75% of every dollar we collect between now and December 31. For those who have contributed to the campaign in the past but haven't this year, we mailed a reminder from Fr. Joe last week encouraging you to get in your 2021 contribution in by the end of the year. The envelopes that were included with the mailing can be returned in the Sunday collection basket, dropped off in the office or mailed in to CSAF. Thank you.

Reminder: Visit the **Santa Shop** this weekend, it is a great opportunity for children to buy Christmas gifts for their parents, siblings, grandparents, teachers, and friends. The cost of the gifts is minimal, so a five or ten dollar bill goes a long way. There are even elves who help the children wrap the presents, so they are ready to put under the tree. This is a longtime tradition at Guardian Angels that for decades **Karen Bollman** and her team have offered. We probably have some current parents who shopped when

they were young. Stop by with the little ones and continue the tradition!


