


Caring & Support Ministries



Pastoral Pearls

Each of us is called by our Baptism to BE the Love of God to those around us – anyone we encounter. And since those around us will at times have a need for more tender care, I thought I would pass on some brief, concise “Pearls” or “Tools” to help us be that Love of God.



TODAY'S PEARL: This Advent time that leads us to Christmas Joy can often be fraught with challenges to Joy. For many people, this time can be hard to navigate through as it brings to mind losses, things missing, loneliness, abandonment, aloneness, abuse, and so many more painful emotions. Grief over the loss of a cherished loved one who is no longer here on this earth, with whom we used to share so much of the Joy of this season, can make it hard to even want to have *anything* to do with Christmas. It can sometimes make one want to hide out from it – from all the still-painful memories that emphasize the deep sense of loss. When this came up recently in conversation, it came to my mind that Advent – truly entering into Advent's prayerful practices - might be a wonderful gift we can give ourselves, if we are really

feeling the pain of grieving (or of anything) at this time. These Prayerful practices are not necessarily connected with memories of our loved one who is gone – not like the cheery bombardment of songs and activities that society offers during what is seen secularly as “Christmastime.” These prayerful practices of Advent can be found in the many “waiting with Anticipation” rituals of our Faith - the prayer services, the reflections, the Booklets of Reflection that walk us through Advent, Advent Calendars that highlight wisdom or action, the Advent Wreath that highlights many reflective themes of Advent - and many other ways to be truly present to the meaning of this rich season of Expectant Waiting, and the unconditional love that God offers to us all. This season also reminds me that, though I love the cheeriness of this season, not all people are able to embrace the happy attitude. Many simply become overwhelmed with the demands of the chaos, yet others are fighting demons that haunt this time of year for them. With this in mind, I realize I cannot expect everyone to be happy, or label people as “Scrooge” if they mope, or even necessarily TRY to make them happy. *Kindness* works well, as long as I am compassionate – more understanding than overly bright and cheery myself. This quote reminds me that this JOY of the third week of Advent is about knowing deep down that no matter what, I am loved. To recognize that even *that* sentiment does not come easy for everyone, means that I need to focus on just being caring, kind and compassionate to people, in small, unpretentious ways. I am Joyful and grateful, God of Understanding, that you will guide me in trying to carefully help people feel “loved” during this season.



Practice the pause. Pause before judging. Pause before assuming. Pause before accusing. Pause whenever you're about to react harshly, and you'll avoid doing and saying things you'll later regret.

Pope Francis and A Global Economy

In a global virtual address in October, Pope Francis outlined nine compelling calls to reform of a

variety of economic sectors. (You can read the entire address at https://movpop.org/wp-content/uploads/2021/10/ENG_Pope-Francis-IV-World-Meeting-of-Popular-Movements-2021.pdf.) His words are a direct appeal to apply our Catholic social teaching to our global economic structures. In coming weeks, this space will offer for your reflection each of his nine calls. They are challenging, based on a view from the margins of society and rooted in care for each other

and for the earth. Last week, the first call was regarding access to the COVID vaccines. This week, Pope Francis offers his second call – for debt relief for impoverished nations:

In the name of God, I ask financial groups and international credit institutions to allow poor countries to assure the basic needs of their people and to cancel those debts that so often are contracted against the interests of those same peoples.

Administrator's Corner

Stewardship Message: We have arrived at Gaudete Sunday (Gaudete is the Latin word for "rejoice") this Third Week of Advent, and the Scriptures take on a joyful tone as we continue our preparations for the feast of our Savior's birth. Our Second Reading gives us cause for joy as St Paul reminds us, "The Lord is near. Have no anxiety at all..." Then he gives us a prescription for maintaining this peace: "In everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, make your requests known to God. Then the peace of God that surpasses all understanding will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus." Paul's instructions for obtaining peace come as an early Christmas gift. They remind us that we can and should go to God with all our needs and present them to Him along with our thanks. This guidance calls to mind a vital aspect of a stewardship way of life: gratitude to God in response to His great love and countless gifts to us. The Gospel passage, from Luke, shows us how to live out this sense of thankfulness, making our lives a "Christmas gift" to Christ in joyful response to His love for us. When the crowds hear John the Baptist's message that their Savior is coming, they ask him what they should do to prepare. He responds, "Whoever has two cloaks should share with the person who has none. And whoever has food should do the same." He tells tax collectors to stop collecting more than is prescribed and soldiers, to be satisfied with their wages. In other words, he tells them to be good and generous stewards of all God's gifts to them! As the great feast of Christmas draws near, let us rejoice in Christ's extravagant love. Let's avail ourselves of the peace He lets to give us. And let's look carefully at our lives to make sure we are indeed making of them a gift fitting for Him.


