### PASTORAL PEARLS

Each of us is called by our Baptism to BE the Love of God to those around us – anyone we encounter. And since those around us will at times have a need for more tender care, I thought I would pass on some brief, concise “Pearls” or “Tools” to help us be that Love of God.



**TODAY'S PEARL:** That is what I want to feel this New Year. “Suddenly” makes me feel like some new and wonderful change is happening. It feels like a Mystery, an Adventure. To “Just Know” is to really tune into my OWN Intuition and listen for that “Still small voice” of God that speaks to me there. “It’s Time” – yeah, sometimes I just *need* a kick in the butt. “To Start” ... It’s time to *act* on what God’s guidance through my intuition is calling me to do. I’ve heard the saying that “A Goal without a plan is just a Wish,” and to that I would add that I need to support it through what I actually *do*. “Trust the Magic” reminds me that there will *always* be magic in whatever God calls me to do, wherever he calls me to go. Trust means also to embrace, to jump in with both feet, to “put my Money where my mouth is.” Trust means I “fake it till I make it,” knowing God will make all things right, somehow, no matter what. Trust seems to be the hardest for me, though – trusting myself, trusting my intuition,.. trusting that God will really come through for me, or work through me. And yet I keep acting as if that is exactly what will happen. Trust. “Beginnings” is the part I

like best about the New Year – each year. I get to begin again. I get to open myself up again, and clear away all the clutter that has distracted me from God’s infinite possibilities for me. I get to work at **believing** again. It’s exciting, because it feels like I’m given permission to follow my curiosity again – see where it leads. This is a time where I can look at the world through fresh eyes, with an open heart, with new enthusiasm (which means, by the way, belief in special revelations of the Holy Spirit) and with renewed energy. Happy New year! Buckle up for this amazing ride!

*Loving God, open my heart to new special revelations of your Holy Spirit. Give me courage to follow my intuition – your voice guiding me. Fill me with the joy of this exciting new adventure, this new year, and show me how to BE your presence to the world, even in small, meaningful, and surprising ways. Fill me with your strength to leap with faith into wherever you take me in this new year. I am grateful for this opportunity again, and all the possibilities. Amen.*

### Pope Francis and A Global Economy Week 5

In a global virtual address in October, Pope Francis outlined nine compelling calls to reform of a variety of economic sectors. They are challenging, based on a view from the margins of society and rooted in care for each other and for the earth. This week, we highlight Pope Francis' fifth call:

In the name of God, I ask arms manufacturers and dealers to completely stop their activity, because it foments violence and war, it contributes to those awful geopolitical games which cost millions of lives displaced and millions dead.

## Administrator's Corner

### Happy New year!

**Stewardship Message:** Today is the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord. For centuries we as Catholics celebrated this Feast on Jan. 6, but the decision was made a number of years ago (at least in the United States) to celebrate the Epiphany on the Sunday which falls between Jan. 2 and Jan. 8. "Epiphany" means "manifestation." It is on this day that Jesus Christ, the Messiah, is revealed as the light of all nations. Officially Christmas is not over. In fact, the recommendation of the Church is that on this day those who display a crèche, a nativity or manger scene, should replace the shepherd and sheep with the Magi and their likely animals on which they traveled as well as their gifts. However, that is all secondary to the real meaning of this day. At Christmas the Messiah Jesus was revealed to the shepherds, who were Jewish. But on this day the Lord is revealed to all nations and to the Gentiles (represented by the Magi). We are all familiar with the star the Magi followed, but we need to understand all that is happening and what it means. This all represents the Light of Christ, a Light which today we honor and commemorate. We are called to be the Light of Christ right now to those around us and those with whom we come in contact. That way we can be the disciples Christ wants us to be. The poet William Cullen Bryant captures the significance of the star the Magi followed very well when he wrote, "O Father, may that Holy Star, Grow every year brighter, And send its glorious beams afar, To fill the world with light." **The Catholic Steward**

**Save the Dates:** The **Fish Fry Friday Core Team** has met just before Christmas and the 2022 dates are **March 11, March 25, and April 8**. The team decided that we again will offer **Drive Through Service** and, we will also offer a walk in, pick up option to for those who may want an odd number of meals. We will be using the same online - prepaid ordering system exclusively for both options and you will have

only the option of ordering 2, 4, 6 or 8 full dinners for the Drive Through Service. For both types of service, you will be able to order either baked or fried fish. The traditional meal will again be served along with the Lake Elmo Inn signature desert. In mid-January, please watch the bulletin and the Friday Blast Email for information on volunteer sign up opportunities. The ability to recruit volunteers is the team's biggest concern. We will continue to require masks and social distancing throughout prep work to delivery to your car at the ramp door to keep everybody safe. Please start planning now on which dates you would like to volunteer.

**Thank You!** The 2021 Stewardship Campaign for last calendar year was successful in that the amount received is very close to the amounts pledged. We have decided to incur the expense for a second reminder letter from Fr. Joe asking those who have not turned in their **2022** pledge cards to do it now. Pledges for 2022 are more than 15% below last year. We will continue to remind parishioners in the bulletin and the weekly blast emails to send in their commitment cards even if not able to pledge at this time.

**Thank You:** We thank all those parishioners, who through their 2022 Stewardship Campaign pledge cards, will be donating to our **Capital Projects Saving Fund on January 15**. For those who don't use the EFT/Credit Card electronic option, please try to drop your check in the plate collection over the next couple of weeks and write in "Annual Capital Donation" on the memo line. Through out years past, we have a special plate collection on the third Sunday each month for Capital Repairs and Improvements. Both collections help pay for general capital needs. We also receive Angel List donations for very specific capital needs that resonate with some parishioners so they can earmark their donation to a specific need. During the year, we receive memorial gifts from families who have lost a loved one and they

decide which project they want to donate to. All these different sources help keep our buildings and grounds well maintained and safe. Thank you.

**Reminder:** Your donation summary statements for 2021 will be mailed the last week in January. Please contact Heidi if you have any question before then.

**Safety Alert: January and February** are prime months for slips and falls when outdoors. Our maintenance team does an excellent job maintaining a safe sidewalk even if is snowing at the time. They will lay down ice melt in areas where there may be ice. We need everyone to be extra careful in the parking lots which become slippery even when they are plowed. 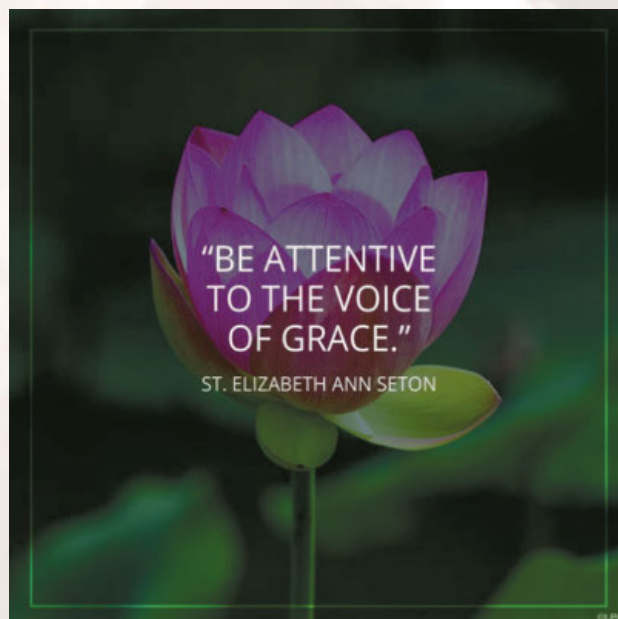
