



ADMINISTRATOR'S CORNER

Stewardship Message: Today's Gospel reading from John recounts the familiar story of the wedding feast at Cana when Jesus launched His public ministry by performing His first miracle at his mother's request. In the midst of the feast, the Blessed Mother noticed that the wine had run out and pointed out the problem to Jesus. Then, she gave the servants instructions that are equally applicable to us modern-day stewards, saying, "Do whatever He tells you." Jesus gives the servants a simple and seemingly mundane task, telling them to fill some stone jars with water. They did what He told them to do. And Jesus used their obedience in the accomplishment of that simple task to perform His first miracle, turning the water into the choicest wine. Our Lord didn't have to include those servants in order to perform this miracle — He chose to. And today, 2,000 plus years later, He still chooses to include us in the performance of His miracles through our cooperation with Him in using the gifts and talents He has given us. What a privilege! Let us take care to listen to our Blessed Mother: let's examine our lives this week to see if we really are "doing whatever He tells us:" cooperating with God to make the best use of the gifts He has given us for the benefit of those around us. If we all take this call seriously, He will perform miracles in our families and our parish. Let us take care to listen to our Blessed Mother. 2022 Stewardship Campaign Update: We are looking much better thanks to the response to Fr. Joe's letter that was sent to those who had not responded to the campaign as of the end of the year. Several cards have been received and many are pledging online. We are hopeful the trend continues because we will begin

the 2022-23 Operating Budget process on February 1 and need a solid anticipated revenue amount that comes from campaign pledges. As we have stated many times, please send in your card, or respond online even if you are choosing not to pledge at this time. By sending in your card, it saves us the costs of future mailings. Last year we had 431 donors, who either pledged \$0 or didn't respond to the 2021 campaign donate \$255,179. We thank everyone for their generous support of our parish.

Recognition: Trustee discussing the details of recognizing our two outgoing longtime trustees, Mike Hansel, and Craig Johnson, we have decided to postpone in view of the COVID situation. If you do see them at church or even socially, thank them for please their unprecedented service. Please watch for a notice in the May issue of the Angel News regarding a public recognition of all that that have done for Guardian Angels.

Thank you: We are very encouraged that most Mass attendees are wearing masks on the weekends... thank you! Until the City of Oakdale or the archdiocese mandates masks, we will continue to strongly encourage everyone who enters our buildings to wear a mask.

Christmas Collection: Due to the fewer number of attendees at our Christmas Masses, our Christmas Collection is over \$8,000 (20%) under budget. We still have Christmas envelopes in the pews, and you can make a Christmas donation online. If you have not made a special donation for Christmas, please consider doing so now. We heavily rely on the Christmas and Easter special donations to help balance our operating budget.

On a related subject, our envelope company indicated there was a delay in mailing out the January and February envelope packets. You should have received them by now. We have seen an increase in the number of new families joining our parish. It does take up to three months for the envelope company to send out your first packet of

envelopes, so please be patient. The easiest method of contributing is electronic giving. Our 2022 Stewardship cards have all the information on them for you to sign up for electronic giving. You are encouraged to use your envelopes for Holy Days and special fund donations such as our endowments. You can also contact Heidi and she can set you up.

Did You Know: That in calendar year 2021 over **63%** of Guardian Angels households supported the parish financially. This is a bit down from previous years where our average was 68%. We attribute the drop to the effects of the pandemic and fewer parishioners coming to Mass and participating in parish activities.


