CARING & SUPPORT MINISTRY



PASTORAL PEARLS

Each of us is called by our Baptism to BE the Love of God to those around us – anyone we encounter. And since those around us will at times have a need for more tender care, I thought I would pass on some brief, concise "Pearls" or "Tools" to help us be that Love of God.



TODAY'S PEARL: Strength is something *I* definitely seek, as I imagine all people do. Everyone wants to be strong. But strength isn't everything – or rather it comes in many packages, some of which I just would not see or recognize as such. There is "Goliath" strong or "David" strong – very different. To be honest, when I imagine me being strong, I much prefer to see the "Goliath" strong – Wonder Woman-type. It is more obvious, and of course I'd like everyone to SEE me as strong. The "David" strong is more of a *surprising* strong, a humble strong, a whisper that helps me persevere. In fact, scripture tells us that we are strongest in our weakness, because that is when we allow God to work. That almost doesn't feel right! How can *that* be strong?! But that's just my ego talking – the part that cares more about what others think of me. When I work with people who are struggling – through grief, through the heaviness and challenges of caregiving, through other life changes or difficulties, and they reach out and ask for help, those are the people I see God working through in their perceived weakness. They are strong when they ask for the help a support group can offer, or a BeFriender, and they become even stronger by working through things together with others. It requires courage to ask for help – to leave room for God to work. That is why it can be so difficult for folks to ask for a BeFriender, or to join a Support Group – they see it as a sign of weakness. It is quite the contrary! Magic happens when we

allow God to work through our weaknesses! These are opportunities for the power of choosing how things will go, (re) discovering our own strengths, making choices to become strong. Flame or Spark... Goliath or David... Self or Holy Spirit ... Our faith in God fans the flames of strength.

Loving God, help me to make room for you in my weakness, so you can strengthen me. Bless me with the courage to ask for help from available sources, to allow you to work through my weaknesses, as I share them with the right other people. Help me to recognize the Spark, and with help, fan it into flames of power and strength and hope. Amen.

ADMINISTRATOR'S CORNER

Stewardship Message: In St. Paul's letter to the Corinthians, it states "If they were all one part, where would the body be? But as it is there are many parts, yet one body" (1 COR 12:18-20). What does this teach us as Christian stewards? It shows us that we all have equal dignity and worth in God's sight, and that if God sees us as equally precious, we should view each other in this same light. It teaches us to humbly recognize our own gifts as well as the giftedness of every member of our parish family. And, while God designed us to be ultimately dependent on Him, it seems He has also designed us to need each other!

This is part of the beauty and richness of a stewardship way of life. No one person can "do it all" in life — whether in family life or parish life. But God does not ask us to do it all. He simply asks us to share the gifts and talents we do have in the season of life we find ourselves right now. It might feel uncomfortable at first. But the good news is you don't have to do it all. Do your part, let your brothers and sisters in the Body of Christ do theirs, and know that the Spirit of the Lord is upon us all as we live out this stewardship way of life.

Help Wanted: Were you one of original 10 Synod Ambassadors in 2019 when the Synod process began? Did you attend any of the Synod Small Group sessions held in September and October at Guardian Angels? Do you want to participate in the next steps of the Synod process leading up to the final Synod gathering on Pentecost weekend? The commitment is very manageable. We will be meeting on Saturday, March 5 for 5 1/2 hours for an orientation session. Between now and then, you will be asked to view any of the videos that you did not view at the 6 Small Group sessions. You will also be asked to read some orientation papers relating to the three focus areas of the Synod. We have one parishioner who has agreed to be one of these parish

representatives to the Deanery Consultation Process. We only need nine more and all parishioners are eligible, and no one will be turned away. If you are interested in hearing more details, please email Fr. Joe or me as soon as possible. Thank you!

2022 Stewardship Campaign

Update: We will begin the 2022-23 Operating Budget process in a couple of weeks, and we are currently short of the anticipated projected revenue needed to continue the programs we currently offer. This year we eliminated all Faith Formation fees which we hoped would encourage families to participate. There were other budgeted items such as raises to staff that were above previous years. In looking at the upcoming FY 2022-23 budget, cuts will be needed to balance the budget. The Finance Council will be meeting this coming week to address the shortfall in pledges for 2022. I apologize for this repetitive ask, but please send in your card or respond online even if you are choosing not to pledge at this time. By sending in your card, it saves us the costs of future mailings.

Congratulations: We congratulate **Barb Smith** and **Linda Smith** as our newest Volunteer Angels Award honorees. In addition to both being long time members of the **GA Crafters**, these sisters-in-law are active in other volunteer activities at Guardian Angels. Please check out the upcoming February Angel News for more information about them.

Reminder: Fish Fry Fridays will be **March 11, March 25, and April 8**. Volunteer signup is available on our website. The process is the same as last year. We encourage you to sign up now to secure your favorite position. We will continue to mandate masks and social distancing throughout prep work all the way to bringing your order to your car at the ramp door. Reminder, the team decided that we again will only offer **Curbside Service** and, new this year, we will also offer **Carryout Service** where you can come in the

main entrance of the church to pick up your order. To order either option, you will have to use the online ordering system on our website and prepay your order. Please watch the bulletin and website for updates.

Update: The construction team that will be building our new Maintenance Building is scheduled to begin their work during the first week in February. Weather permitting, we are hoping most of the work will be done by the end of March.

Did You Know: That we now have **1,414** households receiving our Friday email and over 50% are opening it. COVID has created some real communication challenges for staff and parish leadership. Lower Mass attendance means fewer parishioners picking up the bulletin. The quarterly Angel News is mailed to all parishioners and is the only other communication to keep you current as to what is happening in your parish.
