Choosing Kindness

There have recently been a few more people sitting at local intersections asking for help with food or rent. How does a person who knows the love of a compassionate God respond to them? With kindness. We can acknowledge their humanity by making eye contact and smiling at them, whether or not we choose to open our wallet. At times, human nature might cause us to make snap judgments – such as wondering what they would do with the money if we offered it or whether or not the need is real. All I know is that sometimes if I am having a difficult day myself, offering a smile and a small gift can make both of us a bit lighter. Resist the temptation to idle at that stoplight while looking the other way. Resist the judgmental thoughts that might crop up. Treat this fellow human like the child of God they are and see them. Try not to look away. St. Theresa of Kolkata called this recognizing Christ in distressing disguise. So this week, will you try to take a moment to make eye contact and share a smile with someone you see holding that sign at the intersection? Acknowledge their humanity, whether or not you choose to make a contribution. Trust me, this small act can change lives – including yours.

ADMINISTRATOR'S CORNER

Stewardship Message: The concept of hospitality is fundamental to a stewardship way of life. When we envision hospitality, we naturally think of offering a sincere and warm welcome — to those new to our parish, for instance. We picture inviting them in and making them feel at home and at ease in our presence, communicating to them that they are highly valued. Today's Gospel reading from John invites us to think of hospitality in a slightly different way. In it, we hear Jesus speaking this to his disciples: "Whoever loves me will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our dwelling with him." Jesus is asking that we permit the Blessed Trinity to come and dwell within us. This is a stunning request. It tells us that our first and most privileged form of hospitality should be directed towards God Himself. How does one show hospitality to God? How do we make God "at home and at ease" within us? How can we communicate to God that He is "highly valued" by us? Jesus tells us how: we are to keep His word, to follow His teachings. To keep His word, we must know His word. This takes discipline and effort on our part. We must make the study of Scripture and Church teaching a priority in our daily lives. If we want our parish to be a place of genuine Christian hospitality, we must be sure that our own hearts are hospitable dwelling places for the Blessed Trinity. Then our smiles and words, our greetings and ministries will radiate with the warmth of God's love. And our parish family will become at least a little bit like Heaven on earth. This is the simplicity and glory of a stewardship way of life.

New Maintenance Building Update: In the next two weeks the plumbing, electricity and concrete floor will be completed. Water and sewer are scheduled to be completed in three weeks. They will be hooking up to the main of both in front of the old pole barn and running lines through the HJH backyard to the new Maintenance Building. We are installing internet so we can install our new security cameras. When completed, most of what is in the west end of the old pole barn will be moved into the new space. The west end will be used to store all the Fall Festival equipment and supplies, older tables and all the Boy Scout equipment and supplies. Most of those items are in the containers in the north parking lot.

Catholic Services Appeal Foundation (CSAF) Update: Thank you to the 301 families who have donated already. We are now over 60% of the goal to have 500 families supporting the CSAF. A second letter was sent from CSAF a couple of weeks ago to all who gave last year but not this year. Please respond with a pledge if you can. Going forward we receive 50% of every dollar that we contribute by December 31.

Cathy and Vickie are returning officers and Sue was Vice President last year. These clubs are vital to the life of our parish and donate thousands of hours to make our parish special. **Thank You!**

Thank You! We would like to thank the **GA Crafters** for their generous donation of **\$6,000** towards the purchase of new security cameras that were listed on the Angel List. In addition, they are covering the approximate **\$4,000** cost of new window coverings for rooms M2 through M5. These window coverings will be the same as those that they installed in their GA Crafters room, M6. Not only are these more aesthetic looking but they will also reduce our energy costs because all the windows are south facing. These donations were made possible through their net proceeds from the successful craft sales they host at the Fall Festival, Christmas Boutique and Spring Sale. We thank them again for continuing their generous donation going on 20 years.

PASTORAL PEARLS

Each of us is called by our Baptism to BE the Love of God to those around us – anyone we encounter. And since those around us will at times have a need for more tender care, I thought I would pass on some brief, concise “Pearls” or “Tools” to help us be that Love of God.

Today's Pearl:

"Before you know it, a sense of God's wholeness - everything coming together for good - will come and settle you down. It's wonderful what happens when Christ displaces worry at the center of your life." ~ Phillipians 4:7

WORRY!!!! My worst enemy!!! Yet somehow, my “go-to” friend!! Can anyone relate??? Right now there are way too many things going on in my life that tempt me to worry at every turn. It especially feels that way when everything seems to be spinning out of my control or when everything seems to be bombarding me at once from all directions! I'm sure somebody has had that same thing happen a time or two. If it sounds familiar to you, you may understand my knee-jerk reaction of turning to my ever-faithful, always there for me “friend”(?) – well “fiend” masquerading as “friend.” I really do NOT *want* to worry! But I feel helpless to stop myself. So it is with **very intentional**

effort that I work to turn my focus to Christ, and ask him for help. I need his Holy Spirit to help me to truly trust that if I turn my worrisome circumstances over to him, and really let go, he always comes through. It may be in the way I expected or hoped, or it may be in a different way, but always for the best, whether I knew it or not. Giving total control over to God, when I so like to be in control, takes monumental effort and determination. But once I do get through that, experience has shown me how wonderful it feels to leave it in God's hands and have that heavy weight lifted from me. It is a feeling of being so much lighter, freer. I can do my part, but then I leave the rest for God. I sure hope you have experienced this feeling. I also hope that God will help me have the courage to let go soon.

Loving God, may my trust in you grow ever deeper, even in the face of circumstances I perceive to be truly challenging. Remind me that I am not alone in the desire to be in control, or to want to let go of the burden of control. May I let God carry my worries away – off my shoulders. May I experience that lightness of heart that real trust in your power and your love can bring to me in troublesome circumstances. And may all others who befriend worry also experience the lightness and joy of letting you take care of our problems today. Amen.
