I celebrated Juneteenth last week by taking some of my favorite kids to a play about the holiday at Breck School. After the show, the actors hosted a conversation with the audience and one young performer talked about his experience. He said, "Some adults say that we shouldn't talk about racism because they aren't racist. But that gets us nowhere. Racism is alive in this country. Looking the other way is wrong. It's not enough to say, "I'm not racist." We have to say, "How can I learn about someone else's experience and then walk beside them to change it together?" I was in awe of the young people and the adults who were mentoring them. 

#### **ADMINISTRATOR'S CORNER**

**Stewardship Message:** Today's readings take us back to the basics, inviting us to reflect honestly on our deepest priorities in life. In today's Gospel, from Luke, Christ refers to the struggle to put Him above all else as He encounters two "would be" disciples on His way to Jerusalem. "Follow me," Jesus says to the first man. "But he replied, 'Lord let me go first and bury my father.' The other said, "I will follow you, Lord, but first let me say farewell to my family at home." These two want to follow Christ but only on their own terms, only after taking care of some other, more pressing matters (at least in their own minds). To this, Christ says thanks but no thanks! Following Him requires an unqualified "yes" not a "yes but..." We are called to put Christ and His kingdom ahead of our own plans if we truly wish to be his disciples and to find victory in the battle of selfishness. Living stewardship as a way of life can go a long way in arming us for victory. Stewardship living provides us with a custom-made "training plan" — the commitment to a specific offering of our time, talent, and treasure to the Kingdom of God. It is a plan discerned through prayer and by looking at the realities of our unique circumstances, strengths, and limitations. The daily discipline of committing to the plan strengthens us and helps us gradually move away from the "yes, but" attitude and towards an unqualified "yes!" to Christ and His will. Do not be afraid to give the best of yourself and your gifts to Christ. He deserves nothing less. And this way of life, while challenging, will be characterized by a joy and peace that only comes from living for Him. **The Catholic Steward** 

**Parking Lot Repairs:** We had scheduled to resurface our parking lots this summer, but the high cost of oil pushed the estimated cost to over \$375,000. The higher cost (over \$150,000 over last year's estimate) and the reduction of stewardship financial support, the decision was made to patch the bad areas and delay the resurfacing for a year or two. That will give us time to raise some restricted donations for the project and not have to draw into reserves. For those parishioners who prefer to donate to specific projects rather than general operating expenses, please watch for the kickoff of a special parking lot capital campaign in the August Angels News. We are always worried about trips and falls so we will continue to do minor repairs until the resurfacing costs are more affordable and we have raised some restricted donations to cover the costs.

**Fall Festival Update:** Big Ticket Raffle packets are available in the back of the church. There are packets for all households who have sold/purchased tickets the past three years and all new parishioner families. There are approximately 800 packets which represents about 45% of total registered families. If you don't find a packet with your name on it, there are packets available for you to take by signing one out on the clipboard at the table. Once again, we are offering an incentive for those who sell/purchase all their tickets with \$300 going to the lucky winner which will be drawn on July 25. The next drawings will be on August 15 and the last one on September 12. The Fall Festival Core Team is hopeful that most will help with ticket sales this year as they try to increase Fall Festival net proceeds by over \$20,000 to help balance the operating budget. The official Kickoff Weekend for the festival will be August 6-7.

**New Maintenance Building Update:** We continue to make progress toward completion. Several delays caused by weather, availability of materials and the City of Oakdale have been frustrating. The floor, most of the electrical work are completed, and this coming week the insulation, walls and ceilings will be installed. There will be a delay in the completion of the entry ramps until the water and sewer is connected. The contractor hopes to begin the working on the water and sewer as soon as Oakdale approves the plan.

**Cemetery News:** We hope to have water for the spickets and irrigation to Section E (Northwest) within the next couple of weeks. We have partial irrigation to all the other sections and all the spickets to fill your watering containers are working. Again, materials and availability of our contractor to making repairs are hampering the completion of these projects. Thank you for your patience.

## Tuesdays, July 12-August 30 • 10-11:30 AM via Zoom Thursdays, July 14–September 1 • 1–2:30 PM via Zoom

The Memory Collective is an eight-week online enrichment class for adults living with mild cognitive impairment or experiencing early skill changes with memory, language, visual perception, or processing, filling a gap for those early in their diagnosis and providing meaningful connections with others on a similar journey.

For the first seven weeks, you and (if desired) a guest of your choosing (e.g., friend, family member, spouse) will gather virtually with others for a 90-minute online Zoom session facilitated by Lyngblomsten staff. Each session will feature a variety of educational topics and activities, as well as time for you and other participants to share your life experiences as you learn from one another and build a social group. The theme for the Summer 2022 quarter is Minnesota Travel. Get ready to learn about Minnesota's rich travel cultures and history, including tidbits about musicians and artists and much more! On the eighth week, the group will come together for a tour at a local location. This enrichment class can accommodate eight participants each day (Tuesday and Thursday).
